FBI Captures Extortionist

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The FBI early Saturday captured a man it accused of threatening to dynamite a passenger train in a half-million-dollar extortion plot.

FBI Special Agent D. K. Brown said the extortion attempt was directed against the Southern Pacific Company.

Agents arrested Ira Paul Loux, 35, a dye finisher of Compton, Calif., as he crawled through woods near railroad tracks 19 miles east of Los Angeles.

Brown said a package had been thrown from the train upon a signal from a flashing light as demanded in an extortion letter.

The letter, Brown said, was received by J. B. Pruitt Jr., Los Angeles passenger traffic and public relations manager of Southern Pacific.

Brown said the letter writer threatened to dynamite Southern Pacific's streamliner Sunset Limited No. 2 unless \$500,000 in \$20 bills was paid.

The letter directed that a box of money be placed in a mail bag and thrown from the Sunset Limited by a member of the crew when he saw a flashing light at a designated point last night.

Agents staked out near the point of delivery seized Loux as he approached the tracks after the mail sack was thrown.

Pianist Given Big Reception

WASHINGTON (AP)—They love Van Cliburn in Washington, too—just as in Moscow.

The young pianist who brought down the house in the Russian capital received the same wildly enthusiastic reception here Friday. He got one of the biggest ovations ever given a performer in Constitution Hall.

The audience, obviously taking a shine to the 23-year-old Texan, stood up to cheer the artistry of his piano magic.

As in Moscow and New York, Van Cliburn had the accompanying assistance of Russian Conductor Kiril Petrovich Kondrashin.

"Never before has Washington so honored a pianist, a conductor, or any other musical artist," said music critic Paul Hume of the Washington Post.

"Cliburn has a brilliant technique, and a control that is practically faultless."

Hume did have one criticism of Van Cliburn. He said the bushy haired pianist played Tchaikovsky's Concerto in B Flat Minor with too much restraint.

"The music needs excitement and last night it lacked it most of the time," said Hume.

The critic had nothing but praise for Van Cliburn's 3rd Rachmaninoff, saying "His beautiful piano sang with that touch of genius every great pianist must have."

Students Hit Boy Girl Plan

ITHACA, N. Y. (AP)—Several hundred shouting Cornell University students early Saturday threw a smoke bomb and rocks at the home of the university president and spattered him with eggs.

The incident in suburban Cayuga Heights followed an earlier torch-light rally on the school campus by about 2,000 students in protest against a proposed tightening of the rules on boy-girl parties.

Ignoring the pleas of their student leaders, a contingent of the demonstrators - mostly male - went in cars and on foot to the residence of President Deane P. Malott. The house is a mile from Sage Dormitory for Women, where the rally had been held.

When the group reached the house, they called on the president to come out. They shouted insults and obscenities, observers said, and demanded Malott's resignation.

A smoke bomb was thrown, covering the area with smoke.

Malott, barely making himself heard over the shouting crowd, told the students that they had made their point about the party restrictions but that he was not going to be ruled by a mob.

Rocks and eggs were thrown in his direction. Some windows in his house were broken and he was splattered with eggs.

Old Artificial Respiration Method Now Believed Best

NEW YORK (AP)—A biblical technique for artificial respiration, largely discarded in favor of other methods, now is being advocated once more as the best, after all.

Under the age-old means of resuscitation, the rescuer simply breathes mouth to mouth directly into the lungs of an unconscious victim.

"It's as simple as blowing up a balloon," says Dr. Vincent J. Collins, president of the New York State Society of Anesthesiologists.

At Collins' urging, the New York State Medical Society has officially adopted the method as most effective. He hopes the American Medical Assn. will follow suit at a San Francisco meeting next month.

Countless lives can be saved if people will acquaint themselves with the technique, Collins said. He considers it three to four times as effective as other systems taught in years past, such as the back pressure-arm lift and Schafer plan.

It is so simple that a 9-year-old child can successfully revive an unconscious man weighing 250 pounds.

Others describe it as "unequivocally superior" to manual techniques in all age groups, and the only one which assures that an adequate volume of air will enter the victim's lungs.

Collins said the Red Cross already has reexamined its mouth-to-mouth system in cases involving children and infants, and that some police and firemen have been given training.

He said the essential thing before applying it on any one is that the rescuer should be certain the victim's mouth and throat are clear of foreign objects.

The Bible relates this account of its use in II Kings 4:32-34: "And when Elisha was come into the house, behold, the child was dead, and laid upon his bed. 'He went in therefore, and shut the door upon them twain, and prayed unto the Lord. 'And he went up, and lay upon the child, and put his mouth upon his hands; and he stretched himself upon the child; and the flesh of the child waxed warm. 'Then he returned, and walked in the house to and fro; and went upon him; and the child sneezed several times, and the child opened his eyes."

Father Jailed As Child Dies

BUFORD, Ga. (AP)—An unemployed tannery worker is in jail charged with involuntary manslaughter in the moonshine whisky death of his 10-year-old son.

Sheriff G. R. Leak said Feimer James, 42, is being held in \$2,000 bond for grand jury action.

The sheriff said he signed the warrant yesterday after the state crime laboratory reported that Ray James, a fifth grade pupil, had 0.31 per cent ethyl alcohol in his blood and that this was the cause of death.

James was in an intoxicated condition, Leak said, when he and the boy were found late Wednesday by searchers after they had been missing 28 hours.
