

New Addition At High School Greatly Expands Classroom Facilities

The full scope of the new south wing addition of Klamath Union High School was pointed out to persons attending the wing dedication Friday evening.

Superintendent Arnold Gralapp and Principal Charles Carlson explained during the tour of the new structure that it makes possible a sorely needed expansion program at the high school, and extends the maximum enrollment of the school to about 2,000 students. The school without the wing would accommodate 1,700 students.

Included in the new structure are large and modern classroom facilities for physics and chemistry instruction, a photography classroom, three large music classrooms, four small instrumental practice rooms, a large new cafeteria and kitchen, faculty dining quarters, and a multipurpose stage which will be used for boys and girls physical education programs.

Their wives were given probation sentences May 25 after they admitted a part in the operation, which involved staged rear-end collisions. The prosecution said in court the operations extended into Idaho, Washington, Oregon and California and may have involved fraudulent claims totaling \$100,000.

Twenty-six persons were involved in the ring, officers said. Most of the persons were related and used dozens of aliases.
