Pair Drowns In Point Reyes Surf

SAN RAFAEL (UPI)—Two San Franciscans, a 7-year-old boy and a man who attempted to rescue him, were swept to sea and presumed drowned Sunday during a fishing party at Point Reyes.

Sheriff's deputies identified the victims as Wesley Onishi, 7, and Dan Hadeani, 36. They were members of a Japanese-American party of about 15 persons.

Witnesses said the boy was playing with a bucket in the sand when a wave crashed over him. Hadeani went to his rescue, but both were swept out into deep water.

Bystanders rescued three other persons who were caught in out-flowing waves as they attempted to rescue the floundering victims.

Strike Threatens Aircraft Plant

ST. LOUIS (AP)—The largest employer in the St. Louis area, McDonnell Aircraft Corp., is threatened by a strike.

The 15,000-member Machinists Union Local 2 yesterday rejected 2,791-2,614 an offer which the company said was final. It included a wage increase of 11 to 20 cents an hour the first year and 3 1/2 per cent the second year of a two-year contract. The union asked at least 30 cents.

Fire Finishes Job Of Demolition

OAKLAND (UPI)—The partially demolished St. Paul Hotel here was destroyed early Sunday by a spectacular three-alarm fire which threatened the nearby Athens Athletic Club.

The fire broke out at 1:15 a.m. and completely gutted the interior of the brick building which was once the 12th St. Theater. It was being torn down to make room for a parking lot.

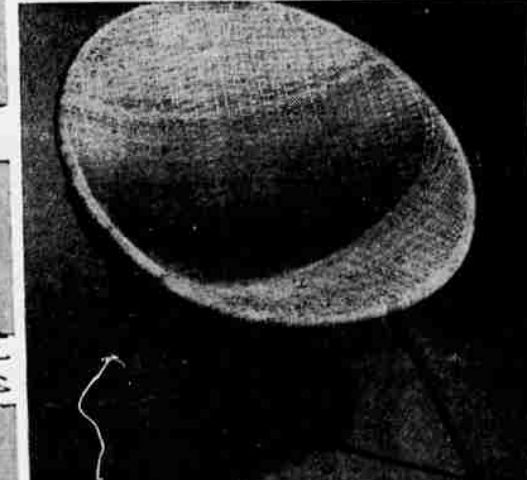
