As fresh fruits come into season, you can dream up other combinations to feature in your low-calorie menus. In that way, you can have your sweets and keep your figure, too.

The menu to serve with the molded salad might include broiled lamb chops, new carrots and peas or spinach, black coffee or tea with lemon.

MOLDED FRUIT SALAD

2 envelopes lemon D-Zerta
1½ cups hot water
½ cup pineapple juice
1½ teaspoon angostura bitters
2-3 cup drained canned unsweetened pineapple tidbits
½ cup (140 grams) diced drained orange sections
2 tablespoons (30 grams) chopped maraschino cherries

Dissolve D-Zerta in hot water. Add pineapple juice and bitters. Chill until slightly thickened. Fold in fruits. Pour into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold. Serve as a salad or dessert. Makes 6 servings. About 40 calories per serving.

Combine one pint of sour cream and one package onion soup mix just as it comes from the package. For one cup of mix, use ½ pint sour cream and three tablespoons (½ package) well-blended onion soup mix.

More than 100 varieties of strained and junior foods for the small fry are packed by H. J. Heinz, International Food Processors and Packers, from the Heinz baby food headquarters at Pittsburgh comes word that the company is introducing screw-top caps on four varieties: Heinz Strained Fruit Dessert, Bananas, Custard Pudding and Apricots and Oatmeal.

Now the lids of those baby food jars will come off with a mere twist of the wrist. They reveal just as easily. This solves the problem of securely capping a jar for storage in the refrigerator and makes the glass jar a more convenient container than ever before.

Because of the thorough sterilization of Heinz Baby Foods, they can be safely kept in the opened container for a period of two or three days if the container is covered and refrigerated. This holds true for both the new screw tops and the traditional pry-off caps, according to C. A. Rumberger, vice president in charge of Heinz Research and Quality Control.

Packing baby foods with screw-top caps has been made possible by recent improvements in closures. Advances in plastics have resulted in gaskets which satisfactorily seal out air and keep baby's food safe.

BASIC FRYER BARBECUE SAUCE

½ cup butter, margarine, or cooking oil
½ cup lemon juice or vinegar
½ tsp. salt

Mix ingredients well, heat to boiling, keep hot for basting fryers. For variety, season to taste with any of the following: garlic, oregano, thyme, poultry seasoning, paprika, dash of hot sauce. For real woody flavor, delete salt from recipe and rub fryers with smoked salt before cooking.

Whole or half fryers will be done in from 1 to 1½ hours; pieces take from ¾ to 1 hour.
