Detroit Tells 1959 Plans

DETROIT (AP)—The 1959 line of automobiles will include more nine-passenger station wagons with improved tail-gates and rear-facing rear seats.

The leveling device that is part of most air suspension systems also will be more widely used—possibly without the air suspension units.

The extra-cost optional air suspension systems have not had the wide appeal the industry generally expected. The same is true of fuel injection.

Industry experts have not challenged the efficiency of air suspension and fuel injection, but both are relatively expensive installations. The leveling device has been particularly advantageous with the lowered overall height of the conventional car.

Some makers will use it with leaf springs or coils. It will be an extra-cost optional item but not nearly as costly as the overall air suspension systems.

The leveling device maintains the vehicle at a set height above the road surface regardless of load weight.

The nine-passenger station wagon with rear-facing rear seat has been a controversial subject ever since it first was introduced. Critics included the assertion it contributed nothing to safer or more comfortable operation. But it has been popular. Some advocates said the rear-facing seats were more easily folded down to provide cargo space in the vehicle.

Styling and engineering of all 1959 model cars already has been determined. Basic design was approved months ago—before the sales lag was felt. This precludes last minute major changes designed to meet changing tastes in car shape, size and engineering.

The tooling orders so far placed do not include any by General Motors, Ford and Chrysler for a smaller vehicle that could be sold at prices comparable with those of the lower priced imported cars. But each of these makers has done much preliminary work on a small unit.

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Farley Entry Into Race Complicates Situation

WASHINGTON (AP)—Republicans viewed with some misgivings today the entry of James A. Farley into the New York senatorial scramble.

Farley, the old pro of the first two elections of Franklin D. Roosevelt, announced in New York yesterday he will be a candidate for the Democratic nomination for the Senate. Twice the Democratic national chairman, he retired from active politics in 1944.

This projected return to politics of the genial former postmaster general complicated an already involved situation in his own party. It gave no cheer to Republicans seeking agreement on a candidate to succeed retiring GOP Sen. Irving M. Laves.

Nominees of both parties will be chosen at conventions late in August.

Sen. Andrew F. Schoepel (R-Kan.), chairman of the Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee, said Farley's move was not unexpected.

"If Jim Farley can get the nomination, he will be a formidable

candidate," Schoepel said. "If he is the nominee, our Republican friends in New York will have their work cut out for them."

Sen. George A. Smathers (D-Fla.), head of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee, noted in a separate interview that his group does not take sides before a nominee is chosen.

"But it is encouraging to us to see men of the stature of Jim Farley enter the rough and difficult field of politics again," he said. "We have several fine possibilities for the nomination in New York and I'm confident the Democrats there will settle on a certain victor in the November election."

Although Farley is 70 years old, his chances of getting the nomination were generally regarded as fairly good by party politicians to whom he is widely known.

However, Gov. Averell Harriman, a candidate to succeed himself, apparently is going to have a great deal to say about the state convention's choice of the senatorial nominee. Harriman stood by FDR when Farley broke with his chief over the third term.

Harriman is credited in some quarters with favoring Thomas K. Finletter, former secretary of the Air Force and a close friend of Adlai E. Stevenson, twice the party's presidential nominee.

Some Democrats here believe Mayor Robert F. Wagner of New York City would be the party's best vote getter. But Wagner is plagued by promises he made in his last mayoral election that he would serve out his term.

Republicans believe that Leonard W. Hall, former Republican national chairman has the nod from former Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and his associates for the nomination to contest Harriman for the governorship.

Hall announced his candidacy for the gubernatorial nomination on Monday.

His chief potential rivals are Nelson A. Rockefeller, philanthropist who has held federal posts under both Republican and Democratic administrations; and State Sen. Walter J. Mahoney of Buffalo, GOP majority leader.

Neither Rockefeller nor Mahoney has announced his candidacy.

No one is openly seeking the GOP Senate nomination in New York.

RABID WILDCAT
NARROWS, Va. (UPI)—Two 16-year-old boys were attacked Tuesday by a 25-pound rabid wildcat. Freddy Ray Ratcliffe and Dave Montgomery were given anti-rabies shots after the animal was found to have been rabid. They said the wildcat jumped on them from a rock. A policeman later shot the animal.

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
