The World Series hero of 1955 made it a great day for the Dodgers on two counts Wednesday night when he hurled a three-hit, 3-0 victory over the Cincinnati Redlegs. It was the third win in four games for the Dodgers, now only a game and a half from the seventh-place Philadelphia Phillies.

Braves 10, SF 9

The Milwaukee Braves took a one-game grip on first place when they beat the slumping San Francisco Giants, 10-9, on Warren Spahn's 11th-inning pinch single; Ernie Banks drove in four runs with two homers and a single as the Cubs clouted the Phillies, 11-5, and Stan Musial had three hits in the St. Louis Cardinals' 6-3 triumph over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Banks, who has hit seven homers and is batting .533 over the last seven games paced an 18-hit Cub attack which also included three hits each by Lee Walls and Dale Long. Moe Drabowsky went the distance for his third win while Robin Roberts lost his sixth game.

Musial lifted his average to .437 with a homer and two singles and rookie Gene Green also had three hits for the Cardinals, who handed the Pirates their eighth loss in 11 games. Frank Thomas had three hits, including his 14th homer, for Pittsburgh.

The White Sox snapped a string of 32 consecutive scoreless innings and three straight losses as Billy Pierce yielded only five hits and struck out six.

Billy Harrell's two-run homer was the big blow of a four-run 10th inning outburst that enabled the Indians to end a four-game losing streak. Relief pitcher Hoyt Wilhelm picked up his second win.

Sarazen Eyes Youth Parlay To Win Open

NEW YORK (AP)—Ageless Gene Sarazen likes a three-way youth parlay in the National Open Golf Tournament next week—Arnold Palmer, Ken Venturi and Billy Casper.

"I'd have to pick them 1-2-3 and let you choose the order," the 56-year-old golfing squire said today, taking a brief respite from his upstate cattle farm. "If I had to choose a fourth man I would be Jimmy Demaret."

"But I can't see it as a year for the Old Guard—Ben Hogan, Sam Snead or Demaret. They're nearing 50 and that means their knees are beginning to buckle."

Sarazen, who shot rounds of 68 and 72 at the Westchester County Club earlier this week to qualify for his 33rd U. S. Open, said knees are the first thing to go for the aging golfer.

"Hogan always has said that putting is the first part of a golfer's game to collapse," the professional star of the Golden 20s said, "but it's not because of lack of confidence. It's the knees. It takes very steady knees to be a great putter. When they weaken, so does the putting stroke."

Sarazen hopes his own knees hold up for an intensive summer golf campaign which includes his 13th campaign overseas.

After playing in the U.S. Open at Southern Hills in Tulsa, Okla., starting a week from today, he will meet Britain's Norman Sutton for the International Seniors Championship at Wallesey, England, June 25, compete in his 13th British Open at Lytham St. Anne's June 30-July 4 and then play in the World's Fair Open at Brussels.

Miceli Rude In Welcome To Fullmer

WEST JORDAN, Utah (AP)—Veteran Joe Miceli gave young welterweight Jay Fullmer a rude welcome to big-time boxing Wednesday night, scoring an automatic third-round knockout.

Miceli weighed 147 to Fullmer's 140. It was the first time former middleweight champion Gene Fullmer's 21-year-old brother had lost in his 14 professional starts.

Fullmer was wary of Miceli's left hook from the start of the nationally televised bout. And he had reason to be. The 29-year-old New Yorker, a veteran of 96 professional fights, calmly waded into Fullmer's brief rushes in the first two rounds, watching for an opening.

He found it in the third and belted Fullmer into the ropes with a vicious left hook. Fullmer didn't actually hit the deck as he floundered for his footing, but referee Ken Shulsen counted it as a knockdown and waved Miceli away.

Diving Group To Form Club
