Maimed Honor Pupil in Talk

LEXINGTON, Va. (AP)—A 21-year-old honors student from Washington, D. C., mounts the platform at Washington and Lee University today to deliver the valedictory. For John Monk Larson it will be more than just the final bright touch on an outstanding college career. It will also be the high point in a 13-year battle against polio.

And, says Larson, had it not been for his handicap, he might not have done so well in college. Outside interests would have encroached on the time he devoted to studies, he says.

Larson was stricken in 1945. He lost the use of both arms but had some control of his right hand. His affliction did not stop him from graduating from St. Albans School in Washington with honors. At W&L, at a political science major, he received only one "B" in an otherwise all "A" report. He was elected to Phi Beta Kappa scholastic fraternity in his junior year.

Only one concession was allowed him by his professors. Since he could write only with difficulty, he was given additional time while taking quizzes and in handling reports.

To graduate "with exceeding honors in political science," Larson by hand wrote a 160-page thesis on "democratic leadership and consent-revolutionization."

This summer Larson will be tutored in French and German and next year will attend the Yale University graduate school on a scholarship. He hopes to continue his work toward a Ph.D. and eventually teach.

Demos Appear Certain Of Gaining Senate Control; Assembly Sweep Possible

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Democrats appeared certain today to gain control of the State Senate in the November balloting.

They quite possibly could also establish a majority in the Assembly, it was indicated by virtually complete returns from Tuesday's primary election.

If the Democrats win control of both houses in Sacramento it would be the first time in 70 years.

There are 40 Senate seats. Twelve Democrats still have two years to serve. Six won both party nominations Tuesday. Two other incumbents, Richard Richards of Los Angeles and Charles Brown of Shoshone, won Democratic renomination and rolled up an impressive Republican vote.

Richards lacked only 274 votes of deadlocking Republican Bradford Trenham who polled 170,920 ballots on the GOP side. The 21st Democratic senatorial candidate, J. Eugene McAteer of San Francisco, won an overwhelming victory for the party nomination. Seeking the seat vacated by Democrat Robert I. McCarthy, who ran for attorney general, McAteer will face Republican Forde Atheran in November.

Eight Republican state senators have two years to serve. Two others won Tuesday without opposition. Eight others won party nomination and the vacated seat of Republican Arthur H. Breed Jr. of Alameda is open. Even if the GOP wins all of those races the party still would have only 19 seats in the upper chamber.

There are 80 Assembly seats. The Democrats won 15 while the Republicans took only two in the primary—either by sweeping both party tickets or by running unopposed.

Nin teen Democratic incumbents will be opposed in November while 36 Republicans face contests.

She presented them to little Bobby Hale before the student body with these words: "My husband was a soldier. He was not a hero. But he was a good soldier. And that is what counts. To be a good soldier... to love America... and this flag..."

She wiped tears from her eyes and handed the flag to Bobby. Then the wide-eyed youngsters saw her collapse. It was not until later that they learned that Mrs. Downey died in a San Francisco hospital of a heart attack.

Bobby came to school earlier than the others yesterday and raised the flag.

Today, Mrs. Downey is being buried in Presidio National Cemetery beside her soldier husband.
