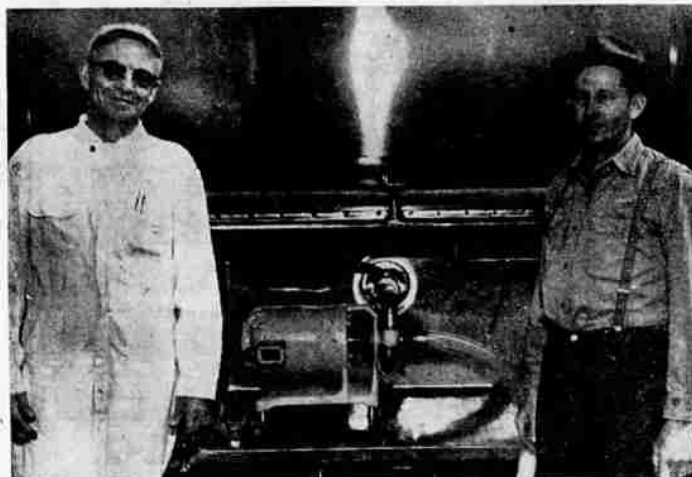
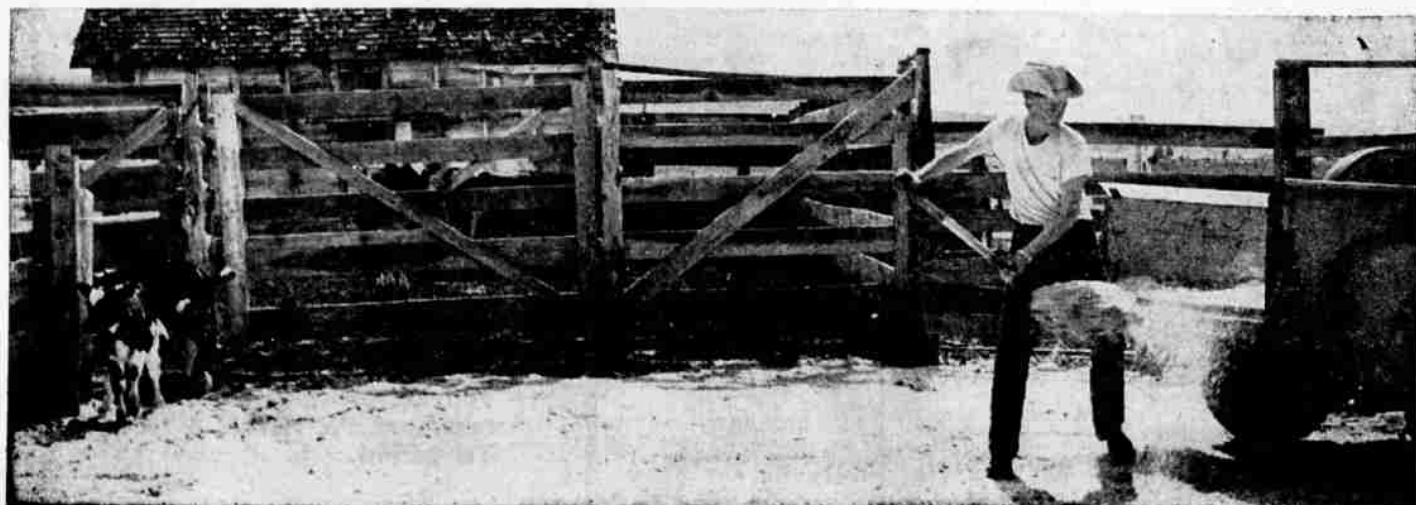




A Grade "A" Family on a Grade "A" Dairy!!
