## Mid-Continent Weather On Better Side

Tornado threats ended and storms diminished in the mid-continent today after a night of violent weather and the second death-dealing twister in a week. The severe weather, with thunderstorms, heavy rain, hail and strong winds, caused widespread damage from southwest Kansas eastward through parts of Missouri, the southern half of Illinois and western sections of Kentucky. Damage in the storm belt was expected to run into the millions of dollars.

Tornadoes struck in Kansas. Hardest hit was El Dorado, 35 miles northeast of Wichita. A twister pounded the community of 12,000 at the supper hour, ripping through a neighborhood of modest new homes. Twelve persons were killed, 37 injured. Its path of destruction covered an area 14 blocks long and a quarter of a mile wide. Some 150 houses were destroyed or damaged.

Stormy weather has hammered wide areas of the Midwest for the last week. A small tornado also hit last night at Pontiac, seven miles from El Dorado, but damage was light and no injuries were reported. A violent hail storm pelted Enon, 40 miles northwest. Hail stones measured up to four inches in diameter. A heavy hail storm also struck Dixon, Mo., leaving a covering of hail to a depth of six to eight inches.

## Church Must Take Lead

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Evangelist Billy Graham says the church must speak out today on the problems of race, alcoholism and mental illness.

Graham told a near-capacity crowd of 18,000 persons at the Cow Palace Tuesday night that "the church must take the lead in all moral and social issues of the day."

One of the major purposes of the church, he said, is to be an influence for good in the community.

His purpose is to glorify God, to provide fellowship and to strengthen religious faith.

"Christ predicted the triumph of the church," he said. "Before his sermon, singer Ethel Waters was introduced to the crowd. She sang, 'His Eye Is On The Sparrow.'"

Miss Waters told newsmen she came to San Francisco to appear with Graham "because my child needs me, so I came out here to smile at him and let him know he was on the right track."

Graham's total audience to date is 603,225.

The crusade ends this Sunday, to be climaxed by a giant rally in Seals Stadium on June 22.

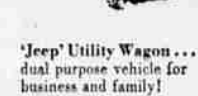
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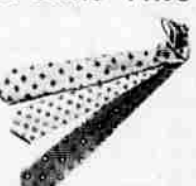
