

Boros Bandwagon On The Move But Boros Still Not On Board

TULSA, Okla. (AP)—The Boros bandwagon began rolling today as play started in the 58th National Open golf championship at sun-scorched Southern Hills but the one guy who wouldn't get on it was Julius Boros.

Boros hasn't done anything sensational during the practice rounds over the rolling 6,907-yard layout. But suddenly a lot of people looked at the records and decided that the big fellow who won the title at Dallas in 1952 under the same sort of weather conditions is a contender to be feared as much as Ben Hogan.

Boros chuckles at the suggestion that he doesn't mind the heat. "I can sweat as much as anybody," he said, "but I usually play as well on long courses as short ones."

That's the big difference. Southern Hills is a course that requires long shots and accurate ones. A player who strays off the fairways is due for trouble even though the bermuda grass rough was cut down to a four-inch depth for the tournament.

Golfers who have played with the 218-pound slugger from Southern Pines, N. C., during the past few days say Boros has been shooting some of the finest golf of his career and has the kind of game that is just suited to the Southern Hills course.

About a half dozen players in the 162-man field scheduled to start play today were rated even with Boros.

There's Ben Hogan, who is shooting for an unprecedented fifth National Open; long hitting Cary Middlecott, who has taken the title twice and lost a playoff last year to Dick Mayer; and a flock of former winners with Mayer at the head of the list.

Boros broke into the list of favorites because of his unusual record in championship tournaments. No other player, except possibly Middlecott, has such a record for consistency in the Open.

A local odds-maker listed Boros

as a 15-1 favorite after shooting a subpar 69 in practice yesterday. Par for Southern Hills is 35-35-70 and very few players have broken it this week. Second choices were Middlecott, Arnold Palmer, the Masters champion, and bulky Billy Casper, who won a couple of tournaments this year but had to drop off the pro tour recently when his game went sour.

"The big problem, according to one player, is building up enough endurance to play 18 holes. The searing Oklahoma sun has sent the temperature into the 90s every day this week.

Weill Works With D'Amato Blessing

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Al Weill, an opportunist who managed four world champions and then managed to severe connections with the International Boxing Club, went ahead today with plans for Los Angeles' first heavyweight championship bout since 1939.

Weill, apparently with the blessing of Gus d'Amato, manager of Champion Floyd Patterson, announced Wednesday that he hoped to co-promote such a contest with the Hollywood American Legion Stadium.

He said although no opponent had yet been selected, it would probably be either Roy Harris, Zora Folley or Willie Pastrano.

The Legion, or at least its matchmaker, Jackie Leonard, was quick to deny any connection with Weill's scheme. But local boxing men were of the opinion that the stadium's board of control, and not Leonard, would make such a decision.

Leonard, known to be on friendly terms with the IBC, had been mentioned as a possible successor to Billy Brown, who recently re-

signed as IBC matchmaker.

D'Amato's almost legendary hatred of the IBC has been the key to Patterson's inactivity since July 1957, when he knocked out Olympic champion Pete Rademacher in Seattle. Since then he has refused to cooperate with any manager or promoter connected with the organization.

But in Weill, who disassociated himself with the IBC after serving for a time as its matchmaker, D'Amato apparently feels he has a friend.

In New York, he told reporters

he felt kindly toward Weill because "he has broken away from the IBC and, in fact, is bitterly opposed to it now."

Weill managed Rocky Marciano during the Brockton Blockbuster's rise to prominence and before that had guided lightweight Lou Ambers, welterweight Marty Servo and featherweight Joey Archibald to world championships. He returned to managing recently.

Fred Tiley, 196-pound fullback from Leighton, Pa., will captain Princeton's 1958 football team.
