Student Picnic—Students in the intermediate grades at Paisley held their school picnic at Summer Lake Park recently. Transportation was provided by Mrs. J.

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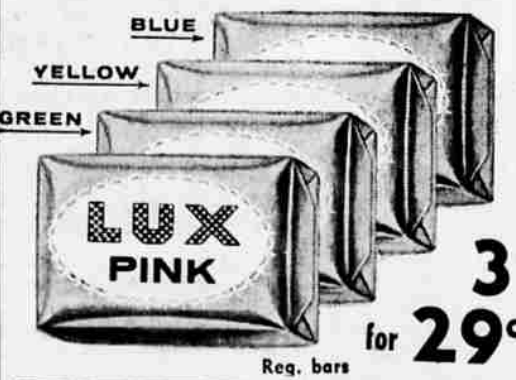


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
