When these young farm lads and lassies begin showing their excellent specimens of beef during the junior livestock fair in August, the judges will unquestionably have a rough time of it when trying to pick a winner.

The below pictured 4-H students are members of the Bonanza Triple "B" Beef Club, and are among more than 100 Klamath County

farm students who are learning the finer points of feeding, grooming and judging cattle. Other 4-H beef clubs in the county are located at Malin, Merrill, Bly, Henley Olene and Keno.

UPPER LEFT — John Heyden, club leader, and Gary Williams, 16, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Williams of Bonanza. Young Wil-

liams is pictured with his Angus calf, Pat, which now weighs more than 930 pounds and has had an average daily weight gain of 1.94 pounds during the past five months.

UPPER RIGHT — David Howell, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charley Partridge of Langell Valley, seems quite satisfied that his calf, Bozo, will be the choice of the judges' eyes come the big fair in August.

The young Hereford weighs about 800 pounds and has an average gain weight of 2.01 pounds daily.

CENTER LEFT — Linda Oberheide, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Oberheide of Bonanza, steps right up with her well-fed calf. The year-old Hereford, Dick by name, tips the scales at about 700 pounds and has gained 2.09 pounds daily during the past five months.

CENTER RIGHT — Susan Williams, the 14-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Williams, Bonanza, is just as certain that her year-old Angus called Niggy will be among the finalists when the county 4-H'ers put their beef on display. The calf has had a 2.01 daily gain and now weighs in at a well-fed 745 pounds.
