Film Shop

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — United Artists and producer-director Otto Preminger have reached an agreement on the release of the film version of a new Leon M. Uris novel, "Exodus," which Preminger acquired prior to publication.

The book, which Doubleday will publish in September, is the story of the historical events surrounding the birth of the new nation, Israel.

A work of fiction, "Exodus," recounts the personal stories and international repercussions that marked the establishment of Israel. Its characters represent a cross-section of the people who made the new nation possible.

Uris, whose credits include the novel and screenplay of "Battle Cry" and the screenplay of "Gun Fight at OK Corral," has been assigned to write the screen version of "Exodus."

MGM has purchased "Worthless Young Man," a recent Saturday Evening Post story by James Atlee Phillips, to be filmed by producer Philip Barry Jr., from a screen play by Ernest Kinoy, who has been associated with Barry in television.

Laid against a background of Texas, the story concerns a teenager with too much money and a passion for sports cars, liquor and women. Tragedy brings him under the guardianship of a rough-shod rancher who tries to tame him as he would a wild colt.

Seven of the country's top progressive jazz musicians — Gerry Mulligan, Shelly Manne, Red Mitchell, Pete Jolly, Frank Rosolino, Art Farmer and Bud Shank — have been signed for Figaro's "I Want To Live!" forthcoming United Artists release starring Susan Hayward.

The seven young jazz headliners will be seen and heard playing "anxiety jazz" written, arranged and conducted by trombonist John Mandel for "I Want To Live!"

Mulligan, a pioneer in the progressive music field, plays baritone sax. Manne will be heard on drums; Mitchell, on bass; Jolly, on piano; Rosolino on trombone; Farmer, on trumpet, and Shank, on alto sax.

Currently before the cameras, "I Want To Live!" stars Susan Hayward as Barbara Graham, California's celebrated "B" girl who was sent to the gas chamber following a highly controversial trial. Walter Wanger is producing and Robert Wise is directing from a screen-play by Nelson Gidding.
