

Subscription Drive Slated

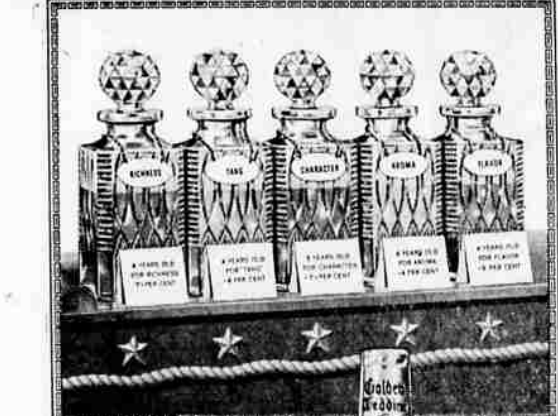
