for peace in 1944, it consists of an introduction and soft music, followed by a hymn. It was so well accepted that 100,000 letters urged its continuance.

MCNEILL'S CAREER got off to a rather shaky start. Born in Galena, Ill., and educated in Sheboygan, Wis., he had no thoughts of radio when he enrolled at Marquette University to study cartooning. But when the family's furniture business collapsed, McNeill took a part-time job at a Milwaukee radio station to help pay expenses.

"The going was a little tough," he recalls. "Even after graduation, I still didn't know if I'd ever make enough money to get married."

After moving to San Francisco, where he teamed with another announcer as "The Two Professors," the future seemed brighter and Don married his college sweetheart, Kay Bennett, and headed for New York. He had hoped the Big City would welcome him as a great entertainer, but it left him broke.

"I always try to be charitable with mother-in-law jokes," McNeill says, "because after two months in New York, it was straight to Kay's house for us."

Then Don and Kay went to work for a Milwaukee station, but Don was soon fired and told, "There's no future for you in radio. Better try something else."

He didn't and was next hired for "The Pepper Pot," a Chicago program, at \$50 a week. But he had no sponsor, and he pessimistically continued his drawing lessons and other free-lance radio jobs while acting as announcer, emcee, and writer on the program.

The turning point came, McNeill

says, in his mail. "Suddenly, the letters began rolling in saying listeners enjoyed a smile at breakfast. Not only that, along came jokes, poems, homey observations on life—such good material that I felt I'd do better to use it than knock myself out writing any more complete shows."

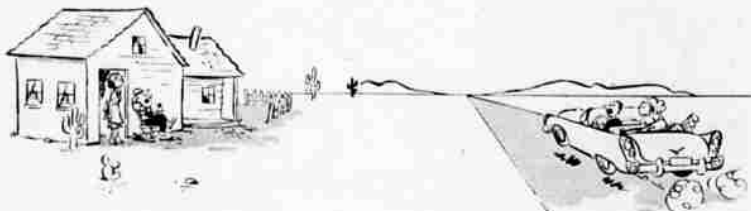
Since then McNeill has been extremely responsive to his listeners. Perhaps that's the chief factor in his success: everyone seems to "belong." In any case, "Memory Time" and "Moment of Silent Prayer" have been important results. A recent letter even led McNeill to change his sign-off from "So long, and be good to yourself," to "So long, and be good to your neighbor."

McNeill uses as many gimmicks as he can for charity drives and other worthwhile causes. During World War II, he sold \$25 million in War Bonds. After starting a Society to Prevent People from Neglecting to Give Presents to Those with Birthdays Around Christmas, he asked for gifts for "unfortunates" like himself (his birthday is Dec. 23) and collected \$5,000 in washers, refrigerators, food, and other items—all of which was turned over to the Salvation Army.

"Our theme," McNeill says, "is to make a neighborhood of a nation. We try to help by creating a wholesome atmosphere, spreading cheer mixed with inspiration, and proving that good citizenship is not only inwardly rewarding—it's fun."

McNeill has three rangy sons: Tom, 22, and Don, Jr., 21, both attending Notre Dame University; and Bob, 16, a junior in high school. They all like to hunt and fish, either on vacation trips or at their Summer home, "Himself's Hideaway," northwest of Chicago. All five McNeills play golf, but the champs are Don, Jr., and his dad, who won a father-son tourney a few years ago.

McNeill values all this enough to turn down New York and Hollywood television offers. He has "commuted" to fill in for Garry Moore on TV briefly, and the Breakfast Club has been televised on a trial basis. But if he ever becomes a regular TV performer, McNeill insists it will be from Chicago. And it will be the same old Breakfast Club that millions of radio listeners have come to love.
