

Bolt Jolted By \$500 Fine For Golf Action

EAST NORWICH, N. Y. (AP)—Tommy Bolt, newly crowned National Open champion, is finding the crown rests heavy on his fevered brow.

Charges of abusive language and generally unsavory conduct since his victory at Tulsa early this month have prompted Professional Golf Assn. President Harold Sargent to impose a \$500 fine on the erratic titleholder.

In a statement issued Friday after Bolt had picked up at the end of nine holes of the Long Is-

land Open Tournament, Harvey Raynor, PGA tournament supervisor, said Bolt's case will be reviewed further by the PGA executive committee at the annual championship at Havertown, Pa., July 17-20, and added:

"Mr. Bolt has been on probation since last December 30 by order of the executive committee and his conduct lately has been in violation of the PGA code of ethics, especially with reference to actions detrimental to sponsors, members of the PGA field staff and other PGA members."

Meanwhile, Arnold Palmer, the Master champion from Latrobe, Pa., held a 3-stroke lead after two rounds. He fired a 69 yesterday to go with his 66 on the opening day for a 135.

Jimmy Demaret of Houston was second with a 71-67-138, followed by George Bernardin of Miami Springs, Fla., Henry Ransom of St. Andrews, Ill., and Don Fairfield of Casey, Ill., each with a 139. Ted Kroll of Sarasota, Fla., and Jay Hebert of Sanford, Fla., were deadlocked for sixth, each with 140's.

Bolt, three over par for the first eight holes, put his second shot about four feet from the pin on proceeded to jab at the ball four times to wind up with a seven on the hole. He then quit.

Raynor emphasized the incident had nothing to do with the fine, as Bolt complained of illness. "I know that for the last six months, up to a few days ago, he had been trying his best to behave himself. I guess the events of the last few days, including abuse of Frank Shields, director of the current tournament, and picking up after nine holes of the Piping Rock Pro-Amateur, were the result of an accumulation of his troubles and frustrations. He tried to fulfill all commitments, and it was too much for him," Raynor said.

Prima Donna Talk Makes LA Play Ball

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (UPI)—Angeles over "Prima Donna" charges against them by a Braves coach might be helping the Los Angeles Dodgers keep their victory "whammy" against the World Champions, Coach Charlie Dressen believes.

"I don't know if that is the reason, but we play very well against the Braves," said Dressen after the Dodgers had beaten the Braves for the seventh time Friday.

Braves coach Billy Herman, a former Dodger himself, made the "Prima Donna" charges against the last place club before the season started. He said they had grown complacent.

Manager Walt Alton didn't commit himself definitely on that theory, saying it's "hard to say if a player is giving more than usually in a particular game."

"But it could be, I suppose," he said. One thing he was certain of, however, his team was "coming alive" in the National League race.

Alton said the team might be "underway at last" with six victories in its last seven and noted that only six games separate the Dodgers from the first place Braves.

Dressen said the Doger pitchers were getting healthier after a siege of sore arms and some of the hitters are hitting. Duke Snider has raised his average 100 points in the last 19 games, while batting .442.

WIMBLEDON, Eng. — Australia's fourth seeded Neale Fraser gained the fourth round of the Wimbledon championships as bad weather curtailed competition.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. — Top-seeded Alex Olmedo, Southern California; Grant Golden, Chicago; Sammy Giammalva, Houston, Tex., and Mexico's Gustavo Palafox reached the semifinals of the Tennessee Valley Invitational Tournament.

HENLEY OARSMEN ARRIVE

HENLEY-ON-THAMES, Eng. NEW YORK (AL)—"Champion of the East Side tonight, Champion of the world tomorrow." Johnny Busso was the self-proclaimed "champion" last night in his dressing room at Madison Square Garden after he had taken a split decision over previously-unbeaten Carlos Ortiz in 10 stinging rounds.

Busso lives in Astoria in the Queens area of New York now but he used to live on the East Side on 20th Street, Ortiz, Puerto Rico-born and now a resident of the Bronx, used to live on the East Side on 28th Street. Ortiz hadn't lost in 27 previous pro fights.

Busso thought he won last night. So did two of the three officials but there were boos at the decision. A ringside poll of boxing writers found six voting for Ortiz, three for Busso and four calling it a draw.

Referee Barney Felix and Judge Bill Recht called it 5-4-1 in favor of Busso. Judge Artie Schwarz had it 6-4 for Ortiz. The AP card was 6-4 for Busso.

It was one of the best fights seen in the Garden this year, an interesting test of a free-swinging puncher (Busso) and a speedy boxer with fast hands pumping a solid body barrage (Ortiz). While Referee Felix let them fight with one hand free, Ortiz had command of the in-fighting. When he broke them up in the late rounds, "no decision" contest. Busso's Busso charged to the front.

"I had it 6-4 for Ortiz but the thing I complain about most was the referee," said Ed Ferguson, Ortiz' manager.

Ortiz was the 9 to 5 favorite.

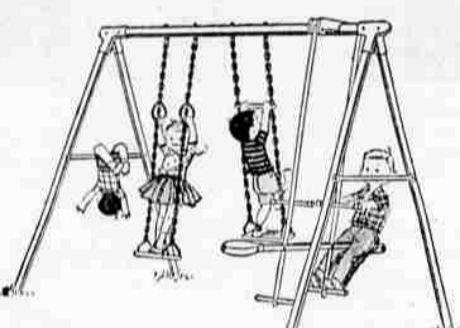

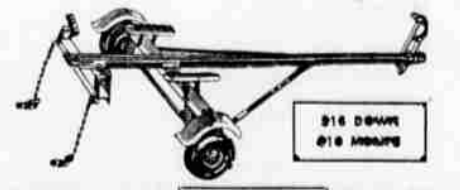
