# Virgil Akins Selected As NBA Boxer Of The Month

MILWAUKEE (AP) — The National Boxing Assn. Tuesday chose welterweight champion Virgil Akins as its boxer of the month for July.

The power punching St. Louis fighter won the nod for stopping Vince Martinez of Paterson, N.J., in June 6 to take the vacated welterweight title.

The NBA's latest ratings pegged Martinez as the second leading contender for Akins' newly won crown behind Cuba's Isaac Logart.

Harold Carter, Camden, N. J., heavyweight, won a 10-round decision from Germany's Willi Besmanoff in Carter's first start since serving a 17-month Army hitch. The NBA promptly listed Carter No. 5 in its rankings.
