U.S. National Bank Marks Big Gain Since June 1957

The United States National Bank of Portland has marked up a 71 million dollar gain in deposits since June, 1957. Total deposits as of June 23 were \$781,704,201 compared with \$710,721,580 a year ago.

During the same period, loans and discounts for the statewide system reached \$336,388,971, a gain of better than 32 million dollars. This increase is an indication of U.S. National's assistance in providing business and personal financing, E. C. Sammons, president, pointed out.

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI)—The Stardust Hotel, a 1,061-room addition to the "Strip" of luxury hotels in this gambling resort, opened today, nearly three years after Lady Luck ran out on gambler Tony Cornero.

Cornero, famous for his gambling boat exploits off the coast of Los Angeles, personally masterminded creation of the Stardust, the largest resort hotel in Nevada. When he died of a heart attack July 31, 1955, the hotel was 70 per cent completed and more than \$5 million had been spent on construction.

The big spending habits of gambler Cornero and the internal squabbles of Stardust Corporation stockholders after he died led to a tieup of funds in federal bankruptcy court.
