According to the latest reports from Diamond, East, Paulina and Lake of the Woods, all cabin and resort accommodations have been taken for some time. The boat rental situation is expected to be jammed with the chances very slim of picking up an open boat for fishing from Friday on through Monday.

The forecast for the weekend's weather is questionable. Not even the weatherman is making any rash predictions. He does indicate high temperatures Friday with possible thundershowers Saturday and Sunday, but that's about the extent of his forecast.

Lake of the Woods should be good again. Several limits were taken this past week in the rain and a nice weekend will produce better results. Spinner or worms or flashers trailed by a flat-fish are the best.

Four-Mile Lake is still fair to good, with bait fish prevailing. Many limit catches of the panzoned kokanee are being taken.

Diamond Lake finds the spawners moving out into the lake's deeper waters.

Monroe Marks For Yanks Lawrence Wins 5 Straight

Manager Casey Stengel already had a waiting list of starting pitchers on a staff that leads the American League in complete games and shutouts, not to mention that 9½-game first place bulge.

In case you're wondering, Peoria, a long-time hot but now late member of the Three-I League, is known for distilleries as well as tractors.

While Monroe, who perfected a palm ball because he couldn't master a change up pitch, was staying out of trouble for a 4-1 victory over Baltimore yesterday, the Detroit Tigers knocked off second place Kansas City 5-0 on the four-hit pitching of Jim Bunning. Washington defeated Boston 5-3 despite Ted Williams in the only other AL game scheduled.

In the National League, Cincinnati defeated Milwaukee 1-0, cutting the Braves' lead to three games. San Francisco defeated the Chicago Cubs 5-2 and closed within .001 of a percentage point of second place St. Louis in the only other game scheduled.

Monroe, a holdover from the spring rookie school who was farmed to Denver for lack of room on the Yankee staff, had worked only 3 1/3 innings since being recalled June 15, and that was a shutout, no-hit relief job against the A's. Yesterday, he allowed five hits, one Dick Williams' first homer of the season that tied it 1-1, walked five and struck out two in seven innings. Ryne Duren mopped up after Monroe tired.

Billy O'Dell (8-9) gave up a run on three singles in the first, then blanked the Yankees until the seventh, when Tony Kubek's single scored the winning run.
