

Rigney Uses Bench To Get Good Results

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Move over, Casey Stengel! Let Bill Rigney of the San Francisco Giants share that throne for the "world's greatest line-up juggler."

Either Rigney has the best sense of timing in making lineup changes, or he has the greatest band of bench-warriors ever to grace a major league roster.

Take your pick.

The Giants are one game out of first place in the torrid National League race, with the season half gone. And to this day, Rigney can't name a starting lineup.

"I just try to keep the man who is not in the game," says Rigney. "When one of our guys goes into a slump, I pull another man off the bench."

"So far the fellow coming off the bench usually has a few hits in his system to keep us in contention."

Broncs Slip Into NW Tie With Yakima

Lewiston climbed into a first place tie with Yakima on the strength of its 13-8 win over Salem in Northwest League action Tuesday night while the Bears were losing 11-4 to Wenatchee.

Yakima and Lewiston now have identical 6-2 records and Wenatchee is a half game back at 6-3.

Eugene swept a doubleheader from Tri-City, 1-0 and 7-1, in the loop's other action Tuesday.

Extra base hits were in order around the League Tuesday.

The Bronco-Senator tilt at Salem was a battle of extra bases. Twelve safeties, including two home runs for each team, went for extra bases. Lewiston led all the way.

At Wenatchee the Chiefs slammed out eight extra-base blows in backing young Claude Osteen, who racked up his 13th win of the season. The 18-year-old left-hander was behind 2-1 briefly in the second inning but his mates staged a two-run third inning and he coasted to the win on 11 hits.

Ted Tappe hit another home run for Yakima. The Bears used four pitchers to absorb the Wenatchee onslaught.

By contrast, tight pitching by Bob Wales and handyman Mel Krause steered the Eugene Emeralds to their doubleheader triumph over the visiting Tri-City Braves. Krause won his first pitching start in the 7-1 nightcap. He played second base most of the season. Eugene won the first game with unearned run, Bob Wales getting credit for the win.

Leon Hurst absorbed the loss although he gave up only four hits.
