Plebescite Date Slated — SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Gov. Mike Stephens says some time before Aug. 1 he'll set the date of Alaska's statehood plebescite. "The people will accept the provisions of the statehood bill," he predicted. "These include the boundaries set out in the bill and the authorization to the President to make national defense withdrawals of 103 million acres in northwest Alaska. "We want to get our elections out of the way so that we may seat our two U. S. senators and our one representative in the 1959 Congress."

Speed Blamed For Accident — TUCUMCARI, N. M. (AP) — An Air Force spokesman said excess speed may have caused the latest in a rash of military plane crashes in the mesa country of eastern New Mexico and west Texas. A weather reconnaissance plane exploded high over Tucumcari Wednesday and fell in flaming bits. The pilot was killed. Col. John Swafford of Laughlin Air Force Base, Del Rio, Tex., said excess speed might have been the reason for the explosion of the U2 jet aircraft. Only 24 hours earlier, another U2 crashed east of Amarillo, also killing the pilot. The 4080th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing at Laughlin has grounded all U2s pending an inquiry. Air Force officials at Cannon Air Force Base, Clovis, N. M., meanwhile were investigating the cause of simultaneous crashes of two F100 jet fighters Tuesday night. Both pilots were killed.

Pike Peaked; Trout Found Atop Phone Pole — MISSOULA, Mont. (AP) — Eugene Pike found a 16-inch trout atop one of his 50-foot power poles recently. Pike manages the electric cooperative here and got a report about a power breakdown. A crew finally spotted something atop one of the poles. A lineman climbed up and found a fat trout wedged between two insulators. Pike figures some eagle or hawk must have dropped the trout.

Sailors, Airmen Set For Typhoon On Isle — TOKYO (AP) — The 500 American sailors and airmen on Iwo Jima prepared today for winds up to 50 m.p.h. as Typhoon Viola swirled north in the Pacific. The 100-mile-wide storm is expected to pass west of the World War II battleground by tomorrow, the U. S. Air Force said. The storm center, with winds of more than 140 m.p.h. was last spotted 350 miles south-southwest of the island early today.

Carrier 'Enterprise' Set For Date With Oblivion

NEW YORK (UPI) — Any day now, a rust-tinted gray ghost of a ship that many regard as the lightest thing ever to float will be tugged from her berth for a date with oblivion.

The fabled "Big E" that roamed the Pacific like the wrath of an aroused nation against the enemy in World War II will glide across still waters to face her last enemy — the scrapper's torch.

The 20,000 tons of courage, luck, and easy-going greatness that the Japanese tried desperately to destroy through four years of agonizing warfare has been sold to a contractor for \$561,333. The sale contract specifies "for scrap only." This will be, surely, one of the noblest and saddest piles of scrap in history.

Her name is Enterprise. Admiral Bill Halsey, who was ramming her hell-bent toward Hawaii even as the Japanese planes came out of the dawn to waken Pearl Harbor, called her "the galloping ghost of the Oahu coast." To fighting men, she was the Big E. As the wrecker's acetylene flame bites into the plates of her

The naval command's traditional "well done" message for valiant battle was a routine accolade on the Big E. At the end of the war Secretary of Navy James Forrestal wrote of her:

"The ship was the heart of the fleet when the war was going badly for us. . . . Her squadrons shot down nearly a thousand of the enemy's planes and sank 74 of his ships. The men who fought her love this ship."
