

### Reason To Believe Natural Cancer Defense Existing

NEW YORK (UPI) — There is reason to believe that natural defenses against cancer exist, according to a report released today by the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research.

The report is a review of recent scientific findings and continuing investigations into the nature of these natural defenses and the way they work.

"From this work there seems hope — admittedly still remote — of cancer prevention, of simple accurate diagnostic tests, of combinations of immunization with chemotherapy, surgery and radiation," the report said.

The report cited as one of the most important findings the discovery in cancer cells of cytospin H, an unusual chemical which may make possible the development of a diagnostic test for cancer.

Researchers are trying to find out if early human cancer regularly produces cytospin H and releases it into the bloodstream.

If it does, a diagnostic test for

mass screening for cancer would become a reality. It is believed that better methods for detecting cancer would allow more than double the cure rate.

The existence in healthy persons of natural defense mechanisms against cancer was evidenced by research at the Ohio State Penitentiary, the report said. Convict volunteers received implants of cancer tissue in the research.

It was shown that well persons can reject implants of human cancer tissue while patients with far advanced cancer cannot. Second implants of cancer cells were rejected by the well convicts even faster than the first implants.

The report said this research showed that two types of natural defense exist — an innate defense in the well person and a second, like defense against infectious diseases, is stimulated by exposure to the disease-causing cells.

The report said that in studies in animals, another group of researchers showed that natural defenses against cancer can be stimulated artificially. They did this by injecting into mice cancer-implanted material called zymosan, which gradually dissolved the cancers and caused them to disappear.

It was believed zymosan did not itself inhibit the cancer directly, to defend themselves against growth.

Sloan-Kettering researchers also have developed a vaccine that prevented one type of experimental cancer in mice. It protected 80 to 90 per cent of the mice treated against a form of leukemia caused by a virus, the report said.

The Buells have owned and managed the hotel for the past nine years, and during this time have leased the dining room and kitchen each year from spring until late fall to various individuals.

The new owners have already taken possession and will manage the tavern and sleeping rooms, having leased the dining room and kitchen to Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell (Mike) Beaulieu. Beaulieu is employed in logging west of Fort Klamath by the Eugene F. Burrill Lumber Company. His wife is in charge of the dining room, assisted by Mrs. Gail Culver, Mrs. Roger Wright, Chilopani, and Mrs. Thomas O. Dyeche of Fort Klamath are employed as cooks. The dining room opened for business under the new management on Sunday, July 13, and will be open during the following hours: Saturdays, 6 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Sundays, 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. and from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. during the rest of the week.

Mr. and Mrs. Buell plan to retire from active business and have moved into the Jenkins' home adjacent to the hotel.

Mr. and Mrs. Earl Nidever, managers of the dining room and kitchen since early spring of this year, have leased a restaurant on Main Street in Klamath Falls, near Wall's Cafe. They also purchased a home in Klamath Falls recently, but will live in their trailer house in Fort Klamath until early August, when their newly acquired Klamath Falls residence will be vacated by its present tenants.

### City Plans Swim Pool

ALTURAS—Promise of immediate action to construct a swimming pool here resulted from Monday night's meeting of Virgil Pratt, commander of the local VFW, and his committee, with the city council.

The VFW group sought the council's aid for the swimming pool fund. Mayor Bud Van Horn, president of the council, and his committee, gave permission for the use of city property located at Warner and Fourth streets, which was formerly used as a veterans' housing project.

The council also donated \$5,000 toward the swimming pool fund, and accepted responsibility for the pool. The mayor appointed George Royall and Glen Flournoy to serve with the VFW committee. Construction of the swimming pool will start as soon as possible.

This action by the city council should assure there being a swimming pool in Alturas this year, after numerous unsuccessful attempts in the past 14 years to get one.

Pratt also announced that very soon the swimming pool committee will approach all the individual organizations in Medoc County and collect for deposit in the bank all available funds for the swimming pool.
