## Man Rebreaks Injured Leg

NEW PINE CREEK — Last Friday Lee McLain had the misfortune of rebreaking his leg which was broken in a car accident a number of months ago and which had laid him up in the Lakeview Hospital for five or six months. The simple mishap occurred late last Friday afternoon when he was on his way home from a little fishing jaunt up Kelly Creek Canyon. He stepped on a rock that rolled with him down a little steep pitch and, in catching his balance, all his weight snapped his leg in the two places it had been broken, above and below his knee, according to reports.

He was all alone at the time but luckily he had taken his pistol along to shoot a few porcupines. As he lay in agony in the middle of the road, he fired three shots and waited—then fired three more. He had only three cartridges left and he decided to wait until after dark when all was quiet, to fire them as a last resort.

Alfred Woods had just come home. He lives up close to the mouth of the canyon. He called to his wife, "Who's shooting up the canyon?"

Lee McLain went up early this afternoon to fish and shoot a few porcupines," she replied from the door. Then about that time they heard three more shots.

"That's a distress signal," Alfred pondered. "Maybe I'd better go see what's the matter!" He waited no time getting in his pickup wagon and going up the canyon road to investigate.

He found Lee in his helpless condition, brought him down and after notifying his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence McLain of the mishap, took the young man on up to the Lakeview Hospital.

Lee had just returned to work for the Modoc Forest Service at the Buck Creek Ranger Station. He will be hospitalized for at least three months more his physician informed his family.

Ralph Conard, who served the larger parish with his headquarters at Cedarville; Mrs. Cora Hater and Nora Ballard, Baptist workers; Mrs. C. E. Robinson and Mrs. Ella C. Stoss, Congregational workers; Joseph Steele of Adin, Congregational workers; descendants of the Baptist Church; descendants of the Journeay family and the Estes family, co-founders of the Congregational Church. Presentation of awards was made by George Royall, moderator of the Federated Church, to Mrs. Katherine Dorris Morris, Harry Flournoy and Mrs. Effie Ester Kaufman for their respective families and to all others in person.

Dr. William Moll Case of San Jose who served the church from 1945 until 1948, came from Santa Rosa, California, and for the occasion donned the Prince Albert pulpit coat he wore in those years. The other speaker was the Rev. Karl E. Olson, pastor of the Federated Church.

At the close of the evening service on July 9, a reception was held in the parlors of the Church of Christ. The birthday anniversary cake of the Congregational Church was given by the Modoc County Historical Society and the following members presided: Mrs. Robert Dorris served the cake after the first slice was cut by Mrs. C. E. Robinson with the aid of the Rev. William H. Youngman; Gertrude James served punch and coffee was poured by Mrs. Warren M. Independence, Missouri, hometown of President Harry S. Truman, was the starting point of the old Santa Fe Trail in 1831.
