Bid Successful For Bly Company

LAKEVIEW — The Bly Lumber Company was the successful bidder at a public oral auction sale on July 14 in the office of Fremont Forest Supervisor C. N. Weaver for 5,300 M board feet of ponderosa pine and 500 M board feet of white fir in the Pothole Creek sale area No. 1 of the Bly Ranger District.

Donald L. McGee, president of the Bly Lumber Company, did the bidding for his company and the price reached \$30.70 for the ponderosa pine and \$4.80 for white fir. An unestimated amount of older dead was sold for \$1 per M.

A total of 98 bids were submitted by five bidders. Others included the Simplot Devco Lumber Company of Chiloquin; the Chiloquin Timber Company; Coder Lumber Company; and Ellingson Lumber Company of Klamath Falls. The advertised prices were \$19.60 for the pine and \$4.80 for the fir.

Board Vetoes McCloud Bid

The Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors, sitting as a County Board of Equalization, this week rejected a protest from the McCloud River Lumber Company over a \$460,000 increase in the assessed valuation of the company's property for 1958.

Milton Gerlicher, assistant manager for the corporation, had asserted that the McCloud Townsite and buildings, where 1,140 employees of the company live, "must be maintained as a source of labor." The assistant manager also pointed out that the rent on houses in McCloud, which average \$29 per month, are subject to negotiation with the union. Gerlicher also claimed large losses by the company both on operation of the townsite and on logging camps at Ponds and Kinyon.

County Assessor I. D. (Babe) Taylor, defending the increase, termed the moderate rents charged in McCloud "an incentive for workers to stay on their jobs" and said he objected to the company owned residences being counted as a loss item.

Most of the increase, \$394,260, was for residences and buildings in McCloud. Assessed valuations on residences and buildings in the company's Kinyon and Ponds logging camps were also increased by \$50,650.

Taylor ended his testimony before supervisors by declaring that he will "from this point on demand that a report be made to me personally on official county forms and under oath. The McCloud Lumber Company must be assessed by the same yardstick as all other taxpayers. Comparable values were used on all major lumber companies."

Total assessed valuation of McCloud River Lumber Company holdings for 1958 has been set at \$1,195,440; considerably over the \$737,560 figure for last year.

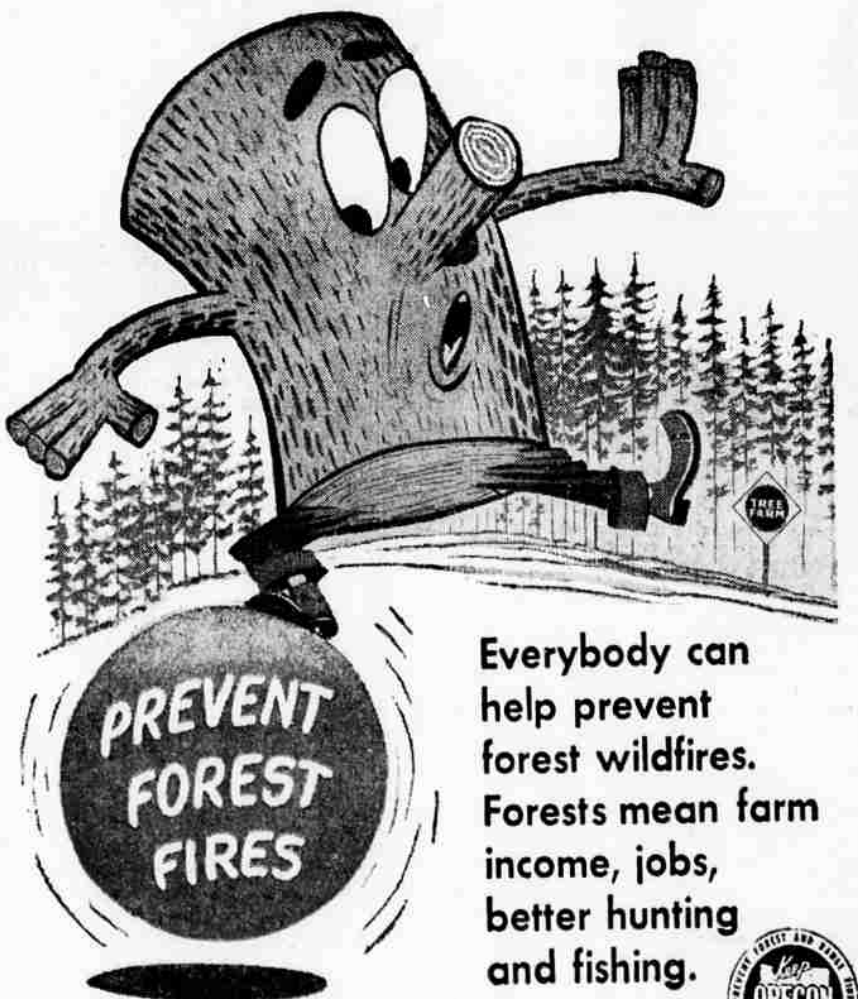
