Work on the 1959-60 timber sale plan will be starting in the near future, the Medford office of the Bureau of Land Management announces.

Interested companies or individuals have been invited to submit their suggestions of timber to be included in the plan, by the Medford District manager, since one of the considerations in selecting tracts is the interest to prospective purchasers. As in the past, priority will be given to the salvage of fire-killed, windthrown and beetle-infested timber, and information about such tracts would be welcome.

timber sale plan prepared by the bureau in which the location, estimated volume and proposed time of sale will be shown for each tract that is proposed for sale during the period covered. The plan is prepared initially by the district manager and his staff on the basis of the available cut under sustained yield management, the personnel available in the district to cruise the timber and administer the sales contracts, sound forest management practices, and interest indicated by prospective purchasers. It is then submitted to the District Advisory Board for consideration and suggestions. The advisory board is composed of representatives of labor and agriculture and of the lumber, livestock, mining and rec-

reation industries, as well as wildlife societies. Operators who desire to suggest tracts which they wish to have considered in the next timber sale plan should get in touch with the district manager's office in the city hall, Medford, as soon as possible. The deadline for submitting such suggestions has been set as August 15. The following figures indicate, in millions of board feet, the approximate volumes that have been budgeted to each forest management area within the district for sale in 1959 and in the first half of 1960 calendar years: North Jackson, 74.7; South Jackson, 22.6; North Josephine, 130.0; South Josephine, 35.2; Klamath, 18.2; total, 286.7.


