Bull Riding Also Attracts Top Stars For Roundup

If the bronc riding, team roping and bulldogging events at the July 25-27 Klamath Basin Roundup have attracted some of the very top cowboys in the nation, the bull riding entries are not far behind. Three stars to watch in these contests, among a number of other outstanding entries, are Joel Sublette, Bob Maynard and Buddy

Peak, who finished fifth, sixth and seventh, respectively, last year in the bull riding world championship standings. Sublette, whose home is in Tucson, Arizona, started in rodeo at Douglas, Arizona, in 1948, and is principally known for bull riding and bareback. However, he is also

Now in his late twenties, Sublette plans on rodeo as a full time occupation for several years to come. His wife, Kathleen, is a trick rider, and the couple spends most of their time on the road during the top of the season. Sublette is currently 10th in the bull riding standings. Maynard, from San Diego, started rodeoing while still in his teens. He first hit the bull riding top ten in 1952, and has stayed there almost constantly since. Like Sublette, Maynard is now in his late twenties. He rodeos the year around, and for the moment has no other plans. He is also entered for the bulldogging at the Klamath Basin Celebration. Peak started rodeoing when he was really young, at 13, and when he was 15 he won a day money at New York. Now 24, he measures 6 feet 1, and calls Tucson home. Other bull riding entries include Johnny Mitchell, Bruce Coker, Steve Johnson, Arnold Hill, Bob Shepard, Ted Tulaires, Jim Charles, Demar Thurman, Jess Ferguson, Jack Middleton, Bill Gog, Al Bocca, Wayne Louis and Bob Cook.
