

Witnesses To Attend Meet

About 40 Jehovah's Witnesses from the Klamath Falls congregation will attend an international convention in New York City, July 27 through August 3.

George Hricizese, presiding minister of the Klamath Falls congregation, in announcing plans of the local delegates, said that a limited program of meetings will be held in the Kingdom Hall, since many of those in charge of various features will attend the Christian Assembly. Lewis Carey, an assistant minister will be in charge of the local group during the convention.

Hricizese said that the local delegates will benefit greatly from the rich spiritual provisions, and the Christian association with witnesses from foreign lands. The convention, he said, will further the understanding and good will among various races and nationalities of Jehovah's Witnesses, and will also demonstrate to the world how the Bible message and Christian living can unite people from all walks of life, regardless of race or other backgrounds that tend to divide the world.

A record attendance of 165,000 gathered at the 1953 international convention in New York City. Yankee Stadium has again been secured and the Polo Grounds will also be used for overflow.

Many of those attending from here will be accommodated in private homes in New York City and nearby areas. A gigantic house-to-house canvass has been taken in an effort to find housing for the worshippers.

Mayor Won't Host Nikita

NEW YORK (AP)—Mayor Robert F. Wagner sees no reason to play host to Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev comes here for a summit conference.

"The hosts will be the federal government and the United Nations," Wagner said, "and we have nothing to do with it."

The mayor made the comment before leaving for a vacation in California.

When King Saud of Saudi Arabia came here early last year, Wagner snubbed him on the grounds that the monarch was anti-Jewish, anti-Catholic and pro-slavery.

Some consider Wagner's remarks yesterday to mean he would be no more hospitable to Khrushchev.

A City Hall spokesman said later, however, that the city was "prepared to do whatever the federal government asked it to do in connection with the proposed extraordinary United Nations meeting."

Local Man Publishes

"Water Cycles and Tree Rings," published in the June issue of Western Water News, and written by Ken McLeod, Klamath Falls, is rated by the publisher to be worthy of serious study.

"McLeod," the publisher states, "is well qualified to discuss the intriguing subject since he is a scientifically trained forester and naturalist. He is secretary of the Klamath River Watershed Development Association and member of the Water Policy Committee of the Outdoor Writers Association of America. He is a Klamath Basin wildlife observer of the California Academy of Sciences and is at present serving as consultant to the California Oregon Power Company."

The article deals with the noted correlation existing between tree growth and water supply.

McLeod conferred recently with Dr. A. E. Douglas, teaching astronomy at the University of Arizona, who has made a study for more than 50 years in the field of determining the effect of wet and dry cycles on the growth of trees.

In his article, McLeod emphasizes the effect of moisture fluctuation on forestry, irrigation, grazing, urban and industrial water, hydropower, recreation and humanity.
