Shaw Named To Replace Rogers As Wire Chief

Sidney D. Shaw of Roseburg has been appointed supervising wire chief for Pacific Telephone in Jackson, Josephine and Klamath counties.

Shaw replaces Rollie P. Rogers Jr. who has been loaned to Western Electric Company for a year's communications duties in the Alutian Islands.

For Rogers, a veteran of almost 20 years in the telephone business, this will be his second tour of duty in Alaska. He worked 18 months with the Army in 1953 and 1954 on the engineering of military communications at Fort Richardson.

After returning from Alaska in 1954 he came to Medford as the telephone company's supervising wire chief with responsibility over local central office equipment, buildings and personnel in 10 towns, including Klamath Falls and Ely, in the three counties.

Shaw took over the job from Rogers on July 21, according to Thayne W. Cole, manager. He has been at Roseburg the past three years as a chief switchman and plant service foreman. Prior to that he worked for Pacific Telephone at Pendleton and Baker.

Youths Damage Street Lights

Pact Approved By Wood Union

McCLOUD — Members of Mount Shasta sub-local 6-64 International Woodworkers of America AFL-CIO, voted July 22 to accept a contract which had previously been negotiated with the Mount Shasta division of the Ralph Smith Lumber Company.

The contract included six paid holidays and two weeks paid vacation for employees with three or more years seniority.

The local recently won a National Labor Relations Board election. Workers were previously represented by an independent union. It represents approximately 97 workers.

Moslems Urged By French To Vote On October Ballot

ALGIERS (AP) — The French army in Algeria is trying to insure Moslem participation in the French constitutional referendum which could give a key to Algeria's future.

The vote is tentatively set for Oct. 5, but the electoral lists have to be completed tomorrow to allow time for legal challenges, issuing of voting cards and other administrative chores.

The vote is expected to be simply "yes" or "no." Yes for sweeping changes in the French political system and Algeria's probable integration into France, no for the continuation of the Fourth Republic.

But in rebellion-torn Algeria the question is whether the Moslem population will vote at all.

By not showing up at the polls, the Moslems would indicate they want no part in shaping France's destiny but favor independence, the rebellion's aim.

As put by the French supreme commander in Algeria, Gen. Raoul Salan, the army's task is "to win the battle of the referendum."

A team of psychological warfare experts, headed by Col. Charles Lachery, began an extensive propaganda campaign aimed at persuading the Moslems to vote. Lachery said the army "will do everything in its power to assure that the people have access to voting places and security while they vote."

Under French electoral law, each citizen is automatically inscribed on the list in his home county when he reaches 21.
