### Oregon Weather

Western Oregon — Fair through Saturday with fog or low cloudiness along coast late night and early morning hours. Brief morning cloudiness in northern interior. Low Friday night 54-60; high Saturday 85-95 in extreme southern interior but 5-10 degrees cooler in rest of interior and 60-70 along coast. Northwestern coastal winds 10-20 miles an hour along coast, increasing locally to 30 an southern shore during afternoon.

Eastern Oregon — Fair through Saturday and slightly cooler. Low Friday night 55-60; high Saturday 80-90.

Baker and vicinity — Mostly sunny Saturday. Low Friday night 45-50. High Saturday near 90.

Grants Pass and vicinity — Sunny and warm Saturday. Low Friday night 58-63. High Saturday 90-95.

Fire Weather — Moderate fire danger in coast range through Saturday. Continued high fire danger elsewhere in the state. Afternoon humidities above 30 per cent in northwestern Oregon except below 30 per cent in Cascades during afternoon.
