WALL STREET NEW YORK (AP) — Stock market prices backed away generally from the latest new peak for 1958 but trading continued fairly active Tuesday.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell \$1.00 to \$182.10 with the industrials down \$1.30, the rails down 70 cents and the utilities down 10 cents.

The decline, though not severe, was the sharpest since July 14. Volume was 3,510,000 shares compared with 3,940,000 Monday.
