



BLACK BOTTOM PIE is a perfect patio party dessert. Of all the seasons of the year, probably the best liked and the one which is most anticipated is summer, because it brings with it an easy-going way of life, less formality in entertaining and perhaps lighter appetites. The abundant supply of fresh vegetables and fruit makes meal preparation easier but once in a while you want to serve a rich, chocolate-y dessert and here is ours.

A GLAMOUR PIE WITHOUT BAKING

Summer is here again, affording the homemaker the opportunity to indulge in a special kind of entertaining—patio dinner parties—which will add an elegant and glamorous atmosphere to her social affairs. But, to glamorize her menu also, she must select dishes which not only are tasty but are also eye-appealing and appropriate for the occasion.

If you are planning to entertain outdoors this season, you might want to try this recipe for Black Bottom Pie, an attractive and richly delicious dessert which requires no baking. The delight of every hostess, it pleases guests too, for its refreshing goodness makes it the perfect complement to any summer dinner menu.

Crush 4 cups Corn Flakes into fine crumbs. Blend 1/4 cup soft butter or margarine and 2 tablespoons sugar; stir in Corn Flakes crumbs and mix well. Press evenly and firmly around sides and bottom of a 9-inch pie pan. Chill.

BLACK BOTTOM PIE FILLING

- 1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin
- 1/4 cup cold water
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 4 teaspoons cornstarch
- 4 eggs, separated
- 2 cups milk, scalded
- 2 squares (2 ounces) unsweetened chocolate
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla flavoring
- 1/4 teaspoon rum flavoring
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar

Soften gelatin in cold water. Combine 1/2 cup sugar with cornstarch. Beat egg yolks until light; stir in scalded milk slowly. Gradually stir in sugar mixture. Cook over hot water, stirring occasionally, about 20 minutes until custard coats a metal spoon heavily. Take out 1/2 cups of custard, keep remainder hot. Melt chocolate over hot but not boiling water; add to the 1/2 cups custard, beating until well-blended and cool. Stir in vanilla. Pour into chilled

pie shell. To remainder hot custard, add softened gelatin, stirring until dissolved. Cool until mixture is ready to set. Stir in rum flavoring. Beat egg whites with salt until foamy. Add cream of tartar and beat until stiff but not dry. Gradually beat in remaining 1/2 cup sugar. Fold into custard mixture. Spread gently over chocolate filling. Chill until set.

To serve, whip 1 cup heavy cream; fold in 2 tablespoons confectioner's sugar. Spread over pie. Sprinkle with 1/2 square of unsweetened chocolate, shaved into curls.

CHICKEN SALAD

Combine halved (seeded) grapes, cubes of avocado and celery with chicken for chicken salad. Serve in lettuce cups along with finger sandwiches and whole spiced peaches.

RAISIN CANDY

For a wholesome sweet to tuck into picnic or lunch baskets or for the youngster's tea party, combine finely chopped light or dark raisins with chopped peanuts. Shape into bars or balls and wrap in waxed paper. Raisins contribute several of the B vitamins, vitamin A, calcium, phosphorus and iron to the diet.
