

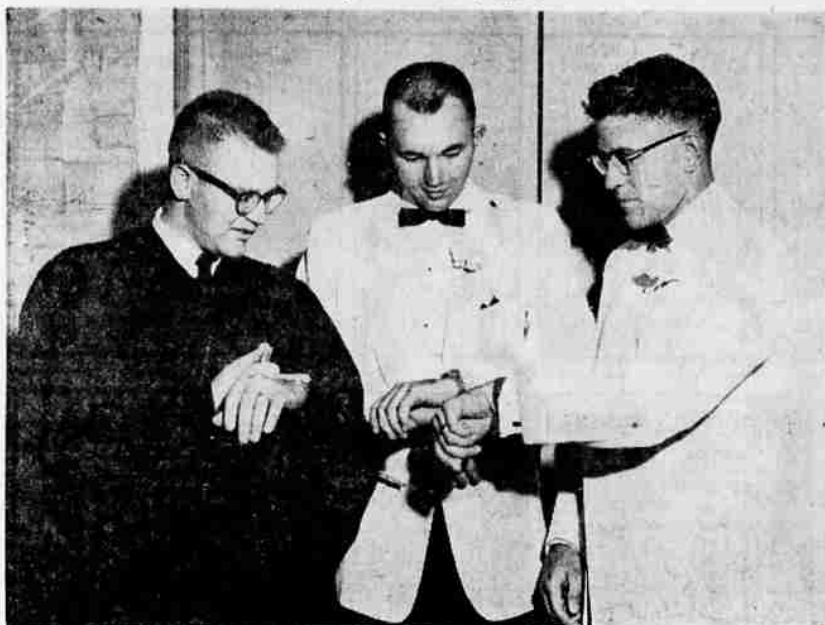
Mary Lou Qualls-Ronald E. Loveness Wed In Merrill Presbyterian Church
