

New Medical Methods Save Mother, Child

SEATTLE (AP)—A young Tacoma housewife is the first pregnant woman to have open heart surgery, and her baby is the first unborn child to be nourished by a machine and donated blood, a team of surgeons said here Friday.

The medical team said Mrs. Thomas Fleming, 23, was operated on July 10 to correct a partially blocked aortic valve. The defect, coupled with the strain of pregnancy, endangered Mrs. Fleming's life, the doctors said. The woman's heart was stopped for 18 minutes during the operation and a University of Washington heart-lung machine kept blood flowing to her body.
