## The Hotter The Better, Say Finnish Sauna Fans

HELSINKI (UPI)—People who like to relax in 200-degree heat once a week are gathering here early in August to exchange notes on the Finnish sauna.

The sauna has spread from Finland's northern forests to Turkey, Germany, America, Canada, Italy, France, South Africa and a host of other countries.

In wooden huts, in chrome-and-marble bath establishments, in corrugated metal shacks and even in tents, men and women from North Cape to Capetown are going in for the superheated Finnish bath.

So by now there are enough fans to warrant international get-togethers. The first such was held in West Germany two years ago. The second will be held here August 7-10.

While the Finns consider the sauna good, clean fun and the best way to get rid of the week's cares, the program drawn up for the Second International Sauna Congress is a bit on the heavy side. Papers scheduled for presentation include one on blood circulation and one on why the sauna is good for athletes. And practically all the lectures will be in German.

German troops stationed in Finland during World War II took the sauna habit home with them. There were an estimated 100 saunas in West Germany after the war. Today there are believed to be a couple thousand.

While the Finnish sauna usually maintains its identity on foreign soil, changes do creep in according to Seppo Lahti, organizing secretary of the Helsinki congress. A Turkish sauna is reputed to include a dry-cleaning establishment. French saunas often include massages as part of the

treatment. And a Finn recently back from Russia recalled with horror one sauna he had visited. Built over 60 years ago, it had fallen on evil days and is now a stable.

But a couple of Russians recently visited a Helsinki sauna club and took copious notes. The result will probably be some new Russian saunas. Soviet boss Nikita Krushchev, here last year, went to sauna with President Urho Kekkonen.

Six saunas were recently opened in South Africa. A Finnish firm sent prefabricated saunas to American troops in Iceland.

But, said Lahti, "there is nothing like a real Finnish sauna."

In years past, it was almost a cradle-to-the-grave proposition. Babies were born in them. People were taken there to die.

Now, though, doctors recommend against a baby visiting a sauna until he or she is at least two weeks old.

The traditional country sauna, perched on the shores of a lake, is a wooden building heated by a fireplace. Temperatures reach the boiling point or beyond. A quick jump into the lake follows the heating process.

The grand old man of Finnish saunas, Professor K. F. Hirvialo, recalled once being in a sauna where the temperature ran to more than 200 degrees Fahrenheit. Another world record.
