Webb Laments Filmland's Lack Of Gracious Living

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Clifton Webb, easily the most elegant actor in movietown, laments the passing of the grand gesture and stylish living that once was an integral part of being a movie star.

Webb stands alone as a vest (weskit, if you wish) wearer in a community that has peeled to T-shirts and blue jeans.

"It's not merely clothes that make the man, or the actor," he said, sipping tea during a lunch break at 20th Century-Fox. "I miss a thing called manners. Courtesy and graciousness have gone by the boards in this town. I must say, things have become very shirtilly."

With a twitch of his refined mustache Webb surveyed his fellow actors and technicians with a cold eye.

"Look at that fellow over there," he said, peering over the top of his bifocals. "He's hardly dressed at all. Well, at least his shirt is clean."

Webb was decked out in a tweed sports jacket and gray flannels. A white towel tucked around his neck gave him a dashing appearance.

"People are much too casual today, but I suppose the Edwardians said the same thing about the following generation. And Lord only knows how the Victorians felt when their era was ebbing," he added ruefully.

The graying actor launched into a dissertation on manners, suggesting that upbringing by parents had gone to pot. He recalled that he was raised in New York, London and Paris. However, Webb was born in plain old Indianapolis.

"Perhaps this slovenliness is a product of those people from the

Actors' Studio," he said. "But I can't understand why it has become chic to have dirty fingernails and mossy teeth."

"With all this elegance of mine, including three million dollars worth of clothes, my roles have run to baby-sitter parts where my wardrobe consists of \$45 suits or some sort of uniform."

Currently starring in "The Remarkable Mrs. Pennypacker," Webb is again thrown in with a pack of children. In this picture he plays a bigamist with 17 youngsters.

"There's a great legend about my hating children," he smiled.

"While I have no kids of my own," bachelor Webb went on, in obvious relief, "I must say that I bear no grudge toward small fry. On the contrary, for some reason children love me. It must be because I have a very sweet nature."

"Even dogs come to me for attention."

Webb attributes this idolatry to his splendid manners.

"I must return to the set," he concluded. "Though I play a bigamist who is the head of an enormous sausage factory, I still maintain an attitude of elegance. And that is a very difficult thing to do."
