CAIRO (AP)—President Nasser granted his government's Red Star Medal today to Air Marshal S. I. Rudenko, chief of the Soviet air force, to mark his visit to the United Arab Republic.

Rudenko paid a 10-day official visit to Cairo last month. Nasser also granted medals to five Soviet officers who accompanied Rudenko.

AF Grounds Starfighter

HAMILTON AFB, Calif. (UPI)—The Air Force has ordered its fastest and newest fighter-interceptor, the F104 Starfighter, grounded for "modification."

The order came from Washington and applied to all Starfighters in the country. The order came after Capt. Iven C. Kincheloe, 29, who flew higher in space than any man alive, was killed recently near Yuma, Ariz., in the crash of an F104.

The Air Force had intended Kincheloe to fly a rocket-powered plane 60 miles into the atmosphere. The Starfighter was grounded once before. That was shortly after Col. Raymond Evans, commanding officer of the 83rd Fighter Interceptor Squadron, was killed while attempting to land one at Hamilton AFB on March 3.

The Air Force said "excessive vibration" was to blame for the crash that killed Evans. A spokesman for the 83rd, which flies the missile-like planes, said of the latest grounding: "It's just like an auto. After six months you stop and tighten the bolts."

Maj. Robert Merritt of Hamilton AFB said "experience has indicated that certain modifications will improve the overall efficiency of the plane."
