### Dionne Quint Honeymoons

MONTREAL (AP) — Marie Dionne, third of the Canadian quintuplets to marry, was honeymooning today with Florent Houle, a 33-year-old court clerk she met last March.

They were wed early yesterday in a secret ceremony to avoid the glare of publicity that surrounded the marriages last autumn of Annette and Cecile. The fourth sister, Yvonne, is a registered nurse. Emilie died in 1954.

Two altar boys witnessed the wedding ceremony and then assisted in a nuptial Mass in the Sacred Heart Chapel of Notre Dame Roman Catholic Church. Church officials would give no details on the wedding.

The couple's honeymoon spot also was a secret.

Marie, the shyest and frailest of the 24-year-old sisters, took preliminary vows of a nun but left the convent after eight months. She opened a small flower shop in downtown Montreal but closed it when more people came to stare than to buy. She reportedly has been housekeeping for Yvonne recently.

George Rouse, Houle's brother-in-law, said the wedding was supposed to have been last Friday. "But somehow the news got around and Florent postponed it until today. He didn't want it to be a circus."

### Michigan Faces Showdown In Case Of 'Human Torch'

FLINT, Mich. (AP)—The State of Michigan faces a possible showdown tomorrow in one phase of its attempt to solve the mysterious burning death of Teamsters unionist Frank Kierdorf and the disappearance of Kierdorf's uncle Herman.

A hearing will be held in Genesee County Circuit Court on the plea for freedom of Jack Thompson, a Teamsters man held in the strange case.

Thompson, 41, a Teamsters business agent, was granted a writ of habeas corpus Monday by Judge Stephen J. Roth, who will hold tomorrow's hearing.

Thompson is held for investigation of arson in a fire at a Flint, Mich., dry cleaning shop at which people say Frank Kierdorf, 56, an ex-convict, suffered his fatal burns. Kierdorf was a Teamsters business agent.

If Thompson is to be retained in custody, State Atty. Gen. Paul L. Adams must prove evidence against him in the blaze. Otherwise, Thompson will be freed. He was arrested on Adams' orders. Judge Roth approved the writ

amid hints of calling a grand jury into the case and as the search for Herman Kierdorf continued unavailing.

Herman, 88, a former Teamsters business agent, vanished prior to his nephew's death after vowing vengeance for what happened to his relative.

At that time the only explanation for the younger Kierdorf's burns was his almost incoherent mumbling of a story that he had been set upon and burned deliberately by two men.

Police later said they believed this a false story and that Kier-

dorf was burned accidentally at the cleaning shop fire. Meanwhile, Herman Kierdorf had been released from custody and disappeared.

At a news conference in Lansing Monday, Adams reiterated a belief that Thompson had a connection with the dry cleaners fire. The attorney general also disclosed he and State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs had discussed the possibility of asking a one-man grand jury investigation of the case. But he emphasized there has been no decision.

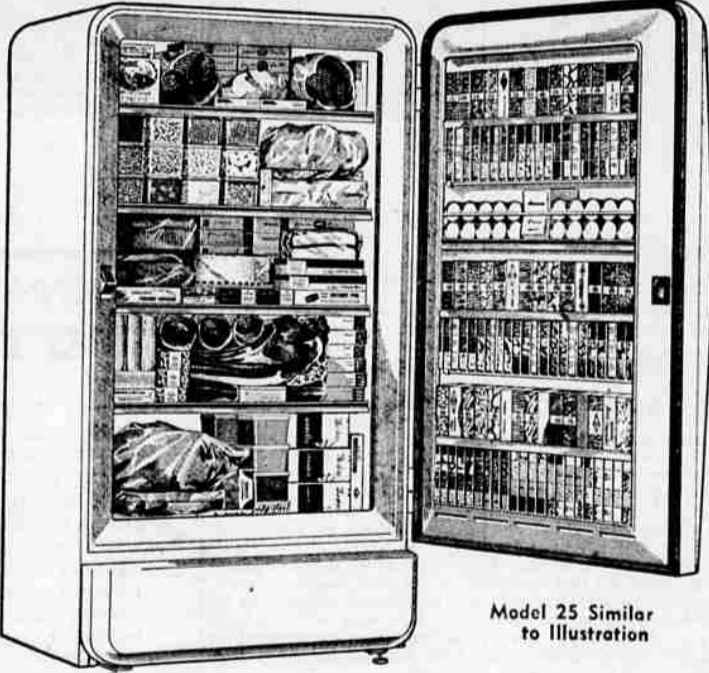
