### Reds Score A-Sub Feats

LONDON (AP)—The Soviet army newspaper Red Star charged today that the United States sent the atomic submarine Nautilus under the arctic ice as part of its war preparations against the Soviet Union.

In an article broadcast by Moscow radio, Red Star referred to "the big propaganda hullabaloo set up by the U.S. press in its attempts to depict the trip of the Nautilus of America's answer to the satellite."

The paper questioned official American statements that the aim of the transpolar voyage was to open up a new sea route for nuclear-powered freight submarines between the world's two main oceans.

"No, the U.S.A. was not interested in scientific problems or a peaceful study of the arctic," Red Star declared. "Nuclear-powered, rocket-armed submarines are meant for war against the U.S.S.R."

MONTE CARLO (AP)—Rumors of another impending birth in Monaco's reigning family have been sweeping the principality and the adjoining French Riviera coast for the last fortnight.

Sources in the Monaco palace refused all comment today.

### War II Hero Fights Suit

OAKLAND, Calif. (UPI)—A war hero who fought the Japanese as a guerrilla in the Philippines said today he will fight a government demand for \$345—the cost of his transportation home.

"I don't want to appear belligerent," said John F. Linehan, 61. "I just know the charge is not morally justified. I'm going to fight this thing through."

The government has ordered Linehan to pay up or to face a lawsuit. The \$345 represents the cost of transporting Linehan home from Australia, where he was taken after a submarine evacuated him from the Philippines.

U. S. Attorney Robert Schnacke said in San Francisco that Linehan signed a promissory note and that officials in Washington have ordered him to take legal action, if necessary, to collect it.

### CAST STARTS FUND

NEW YORK (AP)—The cast of "Sunrise at Campobello," Broadway stage hit, has started a scholarship fund for the young son of Mary Welch. Miss Welch, who portrayed a feature role in the drama, died suddenly several weeks ago. In private life the wife of actor David White, Miss Welch was the mother of a 4-year-old son, Jonathan. Thus far \$1,000 has been contributed to the fund.
