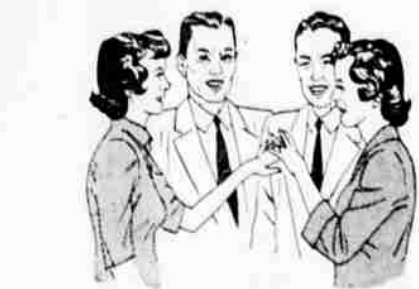

The event was a garden party luncheon at the home of Mrs. Jones. Twenty guests were present and after luncheon a variety of gifts were opened by Mrs. Benson.

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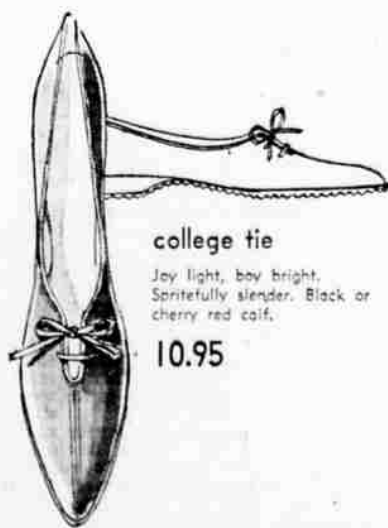
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
