Cairo Radio Dominates Mideast War Of Words

CAIRO (NEA) — The Middle East has become a Mideast Babel where even the muezzin calls the faithful to prayer via a public address system.

But the shrillest voice of all is the "Voice of the Arabs," Nasser's voice, the Cairo Radio.

Its equipment is the highest powered, and its signal reaches vast areas of Africa and all of the Arab world.

Most importantly, it relays the voice of the true prophet — Nasser — to the peasants who cannot read headlines.

There are Western voices here — the Voice of America, the British Broadcasting Company — but they can do little to counteract Cairo's one-sided war of words in the Mideast.

Conversely, the election of Maj. Gen. Fuad Chehab as president of Lebanon was presented as a great Nasser triumph. The theme is that Nasser personally warned the U.S. from the beginning of the Lebanese crisis that Chehab was the only man who could restore order.

Publisher Amin claims that secret radio transmitters, supported by the West, have been operating in southern France, Aden, Cyprus and, until recently, in Iraq. He says that these broadcasts are the most effective because they indulge in personal abuse.

As an example, these transmitters spread rumors that Nasser spends his time drinking cocktails with a mistress in a Cairo penthouse. But Nasser is known throughout the Middle East as a family man, happily married with five children — and also as a good Moslem and hence a model of sobriety. Therefore the broadcasts cut no ice.

They also compare Nasser with Hitler. But in the Middle East, with Israel always in the Arabs' mind, this is a form of praise. Many Arabs remember Hitler with admiration.

They favorite "ogre" in the Mideast these days is Secretary of State John Foster Dulles. Cairo Radio has made his name familiar to even the humblest.

Nasser's dish is a straight appeal for Arab unity, spiced with anti-Western paprika. It is a dish that seems to tickle most palates in United Arab Republic broadcast-

Labor Camp Rites Slated

MALIN—The Christian Center in the Malin Migratory Labor Camp being built by a group of young persons from Stockton, is to be dedicated at a 6 p.m. service on Sunday, August 24.

Assisting with the dedication service will be the Rev. Elben Whitman, pastor of the Malin Presbyterian Church, who will give the invocation; Ross Ragland, president of the Klamath Council of Churches, who will present Bill Kurtz, building project chairman of the Klamath Potato Growers Association; Dick Stevenson, camp manager, and members of the Westminster Fellowship, First Presbyterian Church, Stockton, who have spent most of August here in the big undertaking.

Marilyn Harmon and Joe Murphy will give the response for the fellowship; the Rev. Kent D. Lawrence will speak for the Oregon Council of Churches; Alex Schuster of the Fellowship will lead the litany of dedication, and Lynn McKnight of the Stockton group will present the keys of the building to the Rev. Kent D. Lawrence of the Migrant Ministry, Oregon Council of Churches.

The Rev. H. Edward Hamme, pastor of Hope Lutheran Church, Klamath Falls, will offer the dedication prayer.

The Stockton group came to the Malin community, to build the Christian Center with materials donated locally. All work on the center is gratis and the young people have furnished their own living accommodations and food. The Klamath Council of Churches expresses deep appreciation to all individuals and business firms who so generously contributed funds and materials to make the building possible.

It is to be used as a center for family gatherings during the time migrant harvesters live at the camp, located near the south city limits of Malin.

Youth Ordered To Hospital

A Klamath Falls youth, who previously had pleaded guilty to an indecent exposure charge, was ordered to the state mental hospital in Salem Wednesday for 30 days observation.

District Court Judge D. E. Van Vactor ordered the examination when Douglas Knight Pence, 24, 212 North Second Street, appeared for sentencing. Pence will be returned here following the observation period for final disposition.

Pence, on Monday, had pleaded guilty to a charge of exposure involving a 15-year-old girl on August 15. He was accused of exposing himself to the girl while he was seated in his car on Main Street. The complaint was filed by the girl's father.

Authorities said Pence has had no previous convictions.
