**Bypass Suits Filed With County Clerk**

Four separate condemnation suits for property needed for the U.S. 97 West Side Bypass through Klamath Falls have been filed with the county clerk's office.

Three of the suits were for property at the intersection of Van Ness and Montpelier streets, for which the state has offered payment the owners have rejected. They were filed by the State Attorney General's office on behalf of the Oregon State Highway Commission. Named as defendants, in one or another of the complaints, were Wendell A. Smith and Gertrude Smith, William R. Smith and Dorothy Smith, and R. W. Smith and Alice Smith.

The fourth suit, styled as the Oregon State Highway Commission vs. Sterling Paul Jones et al. is for property Jones owns at 2011 Tunnel Street.

The suit is required because Jones, as division maintenance superintendent for the highway commission, is a state employee. Any state purchase of property from its employees must, by law, be styled as a court suit.

In other suits: Violet Stafford seeks \$40,000 damages, plus \$1,120 special damages, from John Lee Kerbow as the result of an automobile accident at Main and Spring streets in Klamath Falls, December 23, 1957.

John S. Ashley and Eve B. Ashley seek payment of promissory notes of \$816 and \$983, plus attorney's fees, from Jessie J. and Gertrude Harvell.

**Drive-In Banking Set**

The mechanical window for drive-in banking facilities for the Town and Country branch of the United States National Bank of Portland was received in Klamath Falls on Thursday afternoon.

The window had been promised for last Monday but delivery was held up by the truckers' strike. The man in charge of the installation waited until Wednesday and then returned to Eugene where the U.S. National's 67th branch, at Marion Lane and River Road, is holding its grand opening on Saturday.

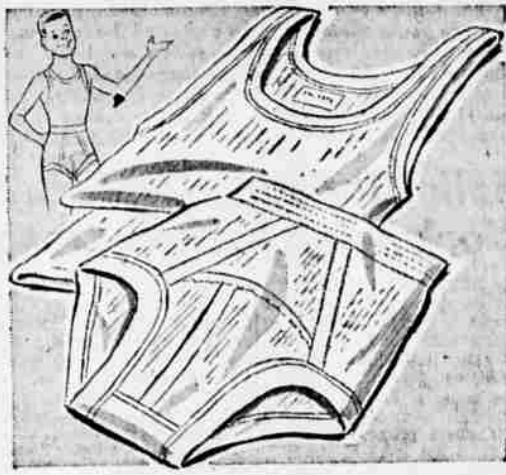
