Three-year-old Suzie is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas A. Hamilton III and the family is visiting Hamilton's cousins, Mr. and Mrs. R. A. McDonald, OTI Road, during his Navy leave before reporting in to school in San Francisco. He was stationed in Japan for 18 months and his family was with him for the last year. The dog, who answers only to Japanese commands, will be on display at the Klamath Dog Fanciers' all breed show at the fairgrounds on August 30.

Little-Known Japanese Breed Of Dog Slated In Local Dog Show Aug. 30

Among the 400 dogs to be seen at the Klamath Dog Fanciers' ARC licensed show on August 30 will be the first Akita ever displayed in Klamath Falls.

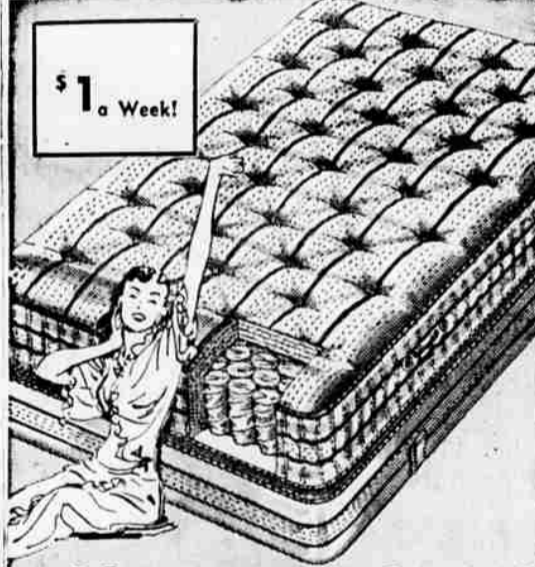
There are only 92 known Akitas in the United States and this one, Teruhime, called Aka (meaning red) for short, was brought here by Kathy McDonald's cousin, Tom Hamilton and his family, from Japan this week. The breed is registered with the Nippon Kennel Club and the Japanese Kennel Club but has not yet received American Kennel Club recognition.

The breed came from Manchuria and was brought to a northern island of Japan where the dogs were used as long as 100 years ago for hunting by the feudal overlords.

Aka's father, Kincho, won 42 cups in Japanese dog shows and her grandfather was Kongo Hirokudo, Japan's No. One Akita.

Hamilton has been a Navy man for nearly 11 years and was stationed in Japan for the last 18 months. His family, including Mrs. Hamilton and their three children, was with him there for the last year. They arrived back at Seattle aboard the SS General Anderson on July 31 and his father, Thomas A. Hamilton Jr., accompanied them to Klamath Falls where they are guests of the McDonalds. They will leave Aka with Mrs. McDonald in the Kay - Mac Kennels here until they find living accommodations in the Bay Area where the family will remain during his school assignment.

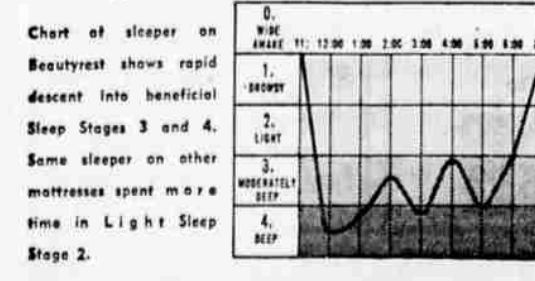

Unsecured Property Taxes Delinquent September 2

DUNSMUIR — Taxes on unsecured property will become delinquent on September 2, the Dunsmuir city clerk's office reported recently. Three hundred fourteen bills for personal property of those citizens not owning real estate were mailed out July 30 on property assessed at \$329,719. This is a slight increase over last year's assessment of unsecured property which was \$307,739.

Those owning real estate will be billed for personal property taxes when tax statements are mailed to them early next month. Tax bills will be sent to 944 property owners, some owning more than one piece of property, on property assessed at \$3,770,844. This is an increase over last year despite the prediction of large loss due to the freeway right of way taking nearly 80 parcels off the tax rolls. Last year's assessed valuation was \$3,733,486.

Utility rolls, high include California Oregon Power Company and Southern Pacific property, did experience a slight drop. This year's utility roll is \$1,753,010 as compared to last year's \$1,640,500. The dismantling of the SP round house accounts for part of that drop.

The figures given by the city clerk's office are net figures with deductions made for veterans' exemptions.

Dunsmuir assessments are figured on the basis of 2.1 times the county assessment. Non real estate owners will pay bills based on a \$1.12 per \$100 assessed valuation because the city clerk's office had made up the tax bills before the city council decided on a two cent levy to pay for civil defense and disaster preparedness. Bills on the secured rolls are being prepared on a 1.14 tax rate which is \$1 per \$100 assessed valuation, the general tax rate: .03 for parks, music and advertising, .07 for planning, and .02 for civil defense.

New home construction, home improvements and the new post office are primarily credited with the rise in real estate assessed values.

2-Way Radio Rig Added

WEED — A two-way radio is the most recent equipment installed in the Weed Community Ambulance, James Mallory, president of the Weed Chamber of Commerce announced this week.

With the installation of the radio system, the ambulance drivers will now be in direct contact with the International Paper Company fire-tower radio which is on a frequency with the California Highway Patrol, Yreka office, and the Weed, Mount Shasta and Dunsmuir police departments. The Weed police radio is on a frequency with the Siskiyou County Sheriff's office, thus making a complete hook-up to meet any emergency need during the ambulance's course of travel or operation.

The ambulance was a community gift presented in 1956 by the Mallory Chevrolet Company of Weed and for use to Weed residents and those of neighboring communities. It has been adequately equipped to meet all registration requirements through contributions from residents throughout the county. The ambulance is housed at the International Paper Company fire station and is manned by the off-duty firemen when needed.

The radio installed was purchased second-hand at \$180, approximately one half the original cost. Contributions to assist radio purchase may be mailed or deposited at the office of the Weed Clinic where the accounting for the ambulance service is handled.

Fair Ticket Sale Opens

Klamath County residents may purchase their reserved seat tickets now for the Greater Oregon State Fair, August 28 through September 6, at the fair office in Salem or at Meier and Frank's department stores, Salem and Portland.

Fair officials said that persons interested in box and other reserved seats should make their purchases immediately while good seating is still available.

They added that on two days, August 28 and September 4, children under 16 will be admitted free. Children under 12 will be admitted free during the run of the fair.
