Quast Wins National AM Golf Tourney

DARIEN, Conn. (AP) — Anne Quast won a well-deserved victory in the 30th Women's National Amateur Golf Tournament. But the girl players still are talking about is the one she beat in the semifinals — JoAnne Gunderson.

And the one with the highest praise for JoAnne is the new champion.

"JoAnne is the greatest, she's just wonderful," Miss Quast burst out seconds after she had been given the championship trophy, following Saturday's sensational 3 and 2 victory over Barbara Romack. "Do you know what she just said to me? 'Anne, the next shot is going to be the hardest you've ever had to make.'"

Miss Gunderson knew because she had won the championship last year, when she was only 18, and had to face the crowd at the ceremony. Most of those who have watched her play believe she'll be back on top soon. She has both the game and temperament to become a great champion.

Miss Quast, a 20-year-old Stanford senior, has a far above average game and temperament, too, but she doesn't plan to stick around tournament golf more than another year.

"Golf has been wonderful to me, but I'll never let it become a career," she says. "I don't intend to play in all the tournaments more than one more year."

Anne played in her first national championship in 1952, when the tournament ended the day before her 13th birthday. She has missed only one since then. In the three years before she really won this made it to the quarter-finals or semifinals.

Rams, Bears Post Second Pro Grid Wins

The Los Angeles Rams, Chicago Bears and Detroit Lions are the only undefeated teams in the National Football League's exhibition season today despite the fact that the pros have been going at it only two weeks.

The Rams and Bears show 2-0 records, while the Lions have won their only game.

The Bears chalked up their second triumph Sunday, a 3-0 decision over the Philadelphia Eagles in Columbus, Ind. It was the only game of the day. George Blanda kicked a 19-yard field goal in the second period for the only score.

The San Francisco 49ers edged the Washington Redskins 20-19, at Portland, Ore., and the Baltimore Colts and Chicago Cardinals tied, 31-31 at Austin, Tex., Saturday night.

Quarterback John Brodie completed 19 out of 26 passes for the 49ers, but it was Gordie Soltau who pushed 'Frisco in front when he kicked a 33-yard field goal with a minute and a half remaining.

Fighter Sought For Alex Miteff

SEATTLE (AP) — Alex Miteff of Argentina Saturday was reported scheduled to fight in Seattle next month but just whom the Bull of the Pampas will meet apparently has not been decided.

The Times said Miteff's opponent would be either Terry Lewis of Spokane, Pat McMurtry of Tacoma or Willi Besmanoff of Germany. The newspaper also said the battle might be nationally televised. If it is it would be the first professional boxing match ever to be televised to the nation from Seattle.

Miteff has a 16 win, one lost record in the last three years.

Tigers Seeking Long Hits

NEW YORK (UPI)—Bill Norman, manager of the Detroit Tigers, man impled today: "Give us the long ball! Just give us the long ball!"

His entreaty was inspired by little more than 10 weeks as manager of the Detroit Tigers and by Norm Siebern's heart-breaking home run in the nightcap of Sunday's doubleheader with the Yankees.

"Yes, indeed," Norman said, "my big discovery as a major league manager is that the long ball is more important up here than in the minors."

Siebern's ninth-inning blast into the lower rightfield seats gave the Yagis a 3-2 victory over the Tigers and nullified the tight pitching of Herb Motord, who had allowed but three previous hits—all in the first inning.

"We haven't been hitting the long ball," said Norman, who replaced Jack Tighe at the Bengal hit on June 10 and was signed last Saturday to manage the club next season — proving general manager John McHale and the Detroit club owners did not regard him as a stop-gap driver.

In Sunday's opener, the Tigers downed Casey Stengel's outfit, 6-3, with a 12-run hit attack. "But," moaned Norman, "only one of those 12 hits was for an extra base — (Charlie) Maxwell's homer."

On the current trip, the Tigers lost eight games and won five. "And long balls cost us half of those eight," Norman continued.

"We've got men capable of the long ball," but Maxwell's been having an off year. He's usually good for 25 homers. Now he's got 10. And (Al) Kaline is coming out of a slump apparently."

Richardson, Olmedo Grab Win

BROOKLINE, Mass. (AP) — Ham Richardson and Alex Olmedo, National Doubles champion, have dumped a problem in the U. S. Davis Cup selection committee's lap—and it's a dandy.

Although they hadn't played together prior to last Wednesday, Richardson and Olmedo completed a sweep to the crown yesterday by defeating Davis Cup team members Barry MacKay and Sam Giammalva 6-4, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4.

The nation's amateur tennis overlords were delighted at the first all-American doubles final since 1948. But the result left the selection committee a double-pronged dilemma for their early September meeting at Forest Hills, N. Y.

Eugene was undefeated in the three-day tournament.

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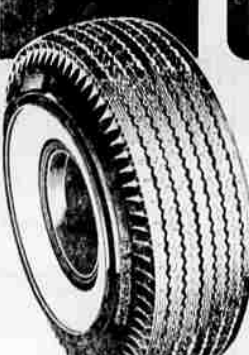
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
