LOS ANGELES (AP)—A former rodeo queen has asked Superior Court to name rodeo star Casey Tibbs the father of her 3-year-old daughter.
Leah J. Conner's suit, filed Thursday, said Tibbs refused to pay expenses when the girl was born at Salem, Ore. Miss Conner said Tibbs has since paid her \$820 for support of the child.
Miss Conner is a former queen of the Pendleton, Ore., roundup. Tibbs, world champion cowboy in 1951 and 1953, appears in a rodeo here Sunday. He is from Fort Pierre, S.D.

Reds Step Up Bomb Attack

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—The Chinese Communists stepped up their artillery attack on the Tan islets in Amoy Bay today, hurling a blistering 7,120 shells into the 136 Nationalist-held acres in an hour.
It was the heaviest concentration in the nearly four years of vest pocket war in the Formosa Strait.
The bombardment heightened speculation that the Communists soon would try to take the islets. Only 2½ miles from their port of Amoy, they are used by the Nationalists as lookout posts from which to alert naval forces blockading Amoy.
The Nationalist island fortress of Quemoy, 15 miles out from Amoy, got off relatively lightly. The Nationalist Defense Ministry said the Reds fired 783 rounds at Quemoy during a four-hour period beginning at dawn. Then the Communist guns turned on the Tans.
Peiping radio warned the Quemoy defenders to surrender or die. The sharp retort from Taipei was "come on and see what happens."
