Oklahoma Appears Headed For Repeal Of Dry Laws

OKLAHOMA CITY (UPI) — The dam that has kept legal liquor out of Oklahoma since statehood in 1907 is beginning to crack.

Oklahoma Democrats, who have always controlled the state government, sent a shock wave through the legal structure of prohibition in June by nominating for governor a 32-year-old reformer who promises a quick vote on constitutional repeal.

The nominee, Tulsa County attorney J. Howard Edmondson, has promised stricter enforcement of prohibition pending its test at the ballot box. Wets have hailed this as their best omen yet. They have argued that Oklahoma will remain legally dry as long as its bootleggers flourish.

And flourish they have. Edmondson said that as a county attorney he has been unable to prosecute liquor merchants due to loopholes in the laws relating to search and

seizure.

The state's bootleg business has been estimated unofficially at 100 million dollars a year.

Edmondson's opponent in the Democratic runoff primary, who had the endorsement of the United Dry Association of Oklahoma, was swamped under the biggest landslide of votes in Sooner history. And last year, the dries lost by a wide margin they attempted to establish local option for 3.2 beer.

Beer, or "3.2" as it is called by most Oklahomans, is legally defined as non-intoxicating by state law—thus opening another chink in the prohibitionist's armor. Beer was legalized in Oklahoma 25 years ago, about the time most Americans were freed from the injunctions of the Volstead Act, or national prohibition.

Edmondson said legalized liquor would bring into the state treasury millions of dollars in taxes which Oklahoma drinkers are now paying to neighboring states.

"I am very much interested in seeing that the right kind of control features are included in any repeal measure submitted to the people," said Edmondson.

"I believe the people of Oklahoma have made up their minds on this issue, but they want to see that adequate controls and revenue features are provided."

The red-haired gubernatorial nominee is considered a cinch for victory in the general election in November barring a political miracle.

His Republican opponent for governor is Phil Ferguson of Woodward.

But Ferguson is even more opposed to prohibition than Edmondson. So, even in the unlikely event there is a GOP victory this fall, one of Will Rogers' classic remarks seems headed for oblivion.

"Oklahomans will vote dry," said the humorist, "as long as they can stagger to the polls."

Small Forest Owners Hold Much Of Land

Small forest owners are still an important part of Oregon's timber industry, operating 50 per cent of the state's private commercial forest acreage, an Oregon State College forester reports.

While small forest holdings are gradually being bought up by large operators, there are still about 35,000 so-called small owners in Oregon, says Charles Ross, OSC farm forestry specialist.

Small forest land ownerships—holdings of less than 5,000 acres—totalled 4,923,000 acres in 1952, latest actual count reported by the U.S. Forest Service. All private commercial forest lands in Oregon total 9,768,000 acres.

Nearly one million acres of the small holdings fall in the 10 to 99-commercial forest lands in Oregon. More than 21,000 western Oregon owners in this class operate a total of 835,000 acres.

Clackamas County leads the state in numbers of owners in the 10 to 99-acre class with 2,550 owners having 115,000 acres. Lane County has 2,408 owners with 50,000 acres, and Jackson County's 2,006 small owners total 83,000 acres. Douglas County is also credited with 83,000 acres in this class with 1,195 owners.

A further breakdown of small forest contributions to the state are made for ownerships up to 2,000 acres in western Oregon and up to 5,000 acres in eastern Oregon. These forests are estimated to produce about two billion board feet annually with value at approximately 250 million dollars.
