Box Camera Invented 70 Years Ago

Seventy years ago this past June — in 1888 — George Eastman introduced the first box camera. It was an oblong black box that took small round pictures two and one-half inches in diameter.

Small enough to be held in the hand, the camera sold ready-loaded with enough paper-backed stripping film to take 100 black-and-white snapshots. The price, including film, \$25. Nowadays, a box-type camera sells without film for as little as \$5.95.

Since that milestone in photography, the amateur photographer has multiplied rapidly. In 1957, about 45 million Americans took over two billion pictures.

The photographer made an exposure in the No. 1 Kodak by pulling a string that set the shutter and then pressing a button that released it.

When 100 snapshots had been taken, he sent the camera back to Rochester, New York, where the film was developed and prints were made. For about \$10, about a week's wages in those days, prints, negatives and the camera reloaded with film were returned to him.

On September 4, 1888, Eastman registered the Kodak trademark. He had devised it after lengthy experimentation to find a word that would be spelled easily and pronounced readily in a large number of languages.

"The letter 'K' had been a favorite with me," Eastman said. "It seemed a strong, incisive sort of letter. . . it became a question of trying out a great combination of letters that made words startling and ending with 'K.' The word Kodak is the result."
