

### Crater Lake National Park Reports More Cars, People

More cars, carrying more visitors to Crater Lake National Park are reported this year than last by the park rangers. A total of 32,759 cars entered the park during August, bringing a total of 119,576 visitors. Total number of visitors so far during 1958 has been 287,853, or nearly 9,000 more than the cumulative figure at this time last year.

Travel in August to the park this year showed an increase of 2.6 per cent over August of last year and 6.3 per cent increase over August, 1956, which was a peak year.

To date this year there is an increase in travel to the park of 3.2 per cent over 1957 and a decrease of 0.3 per cent over the cumulative total at this time in 1956.

The big jump in visitor figures was noted in campground use at the park this year. During the month of August, visitors to the campgrounds in the park were 23.6 per cent over the same month last year and 44.8 per cent over

August, 1956.

By the close of this season, the last 62 units at the Mazama Campgrounds will be completed, bringing the total there to 120 camps-

units. The work is being done by Freeland Construction Company of Columbia City, as part of the contract awarded early in August by Tom Williams, park superintendent. Freeland's bid of nearly \$400,000 covered construction of a new covered entranceway to the administration building, new entry station and the rest room facilities at

the Mazama Campgrounds. A survey conducted by park rangers at the Rim Campgrounds shows that the average camping party is comprised of 3.5 persons and the average length of stay this year has been 1.8 days. Last year, camping groups were averaging a stay of two full days. "We are seeing more house trailers in the park this year than ever before," the rangers report.

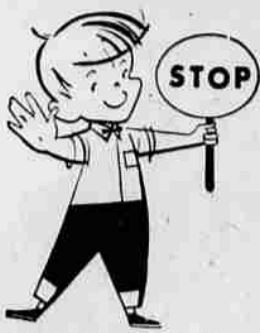
