

New Aeronautics Agency Planning To Probe Skies

WASHINGTON (AP)—The newly established National Aeronautics and Space Administration has detailed plans to probe the skies with a whole series of earth satellites.

These are for the future ahead. For the more distant future NASA is already at work on projects to explore the moon and then move on to the planets.

NASA's program plans were disclosed for the first time at a packed-to-capacity dinner meeting of the Institute of the Aeronautical Sciences last night.

They were outlined by Edgar M. Cortright of the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory at Cleveland, a major unit of the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics. NASA is in the process of space-age transformation into NASA.

Cortright said he believed that through the NASA programs man would:

1. Be placed in orbit around the earth within two years.
2. Land on the moon and return to earth, within 6 to 10 years.

Quentin Parolee Asks For Return To Penitentiary

SAN QUENTIN, Calif. (UPI)—California observed Admission Day Tuesday but San Quentin Prison.

A parolee convict, Herschel R. Morgan, 39, San Mateo, Calif., pounded on the gates of the prison and pleaded with officials to let him in.

"I want to come back," he cried. "Please let me in."

Associate Warden Louis Nelson refused.

"You've got to do these things right," he explained.

Morgan explained he was sentenced from Tulare County in 1949 to a term of one year to life for lewd and lascivious conduct. He had been on parole for three years and had one more year to serve.

Herschel then said he was breaking parole at that very moment by having left San Mateo County without notifying his parole officer.

"I owe money on my house... I'm in trouble," he said.

Nelson called the Marin County Sheriff's office. A deputy took Morgan away to be booked as a parole violator in county jail.

Extension Set For Zoo Line

PORTLAND (AP)—The Portland Zoo Commission will extend its zoo line to the Oregon Centennial Exposition next year, where it will operate a model steam engine and train.

The Oregon Centennial Commission granted permission for the rail operation. All revenues from rides on the trains will be used by the Zoo Commission to pay construction costs.

The commission said the track and park will be moved to Washington Trail extension of the zoo railroad after it completes the centennial run.

Objections were voiced by some members of the Centennial Commission who thought all revenue from such concessions should go to the Centennial Exposition. A majority finally approved the installation Tuesday.
