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Agriculture Department Estimates NW Wheat Crop

WASHINGTON (AP) — Washington and Oregon will pour more than 6½ million bushels into the nation's bumper spring wheat crop, estimated at 275,696,000 bushels.

The estimate issued Wednesday by the Agriculture Department is 25 million bushels higher than the August prediction and brought this year's total wheat production figure to 1,446,464,000 bushels, an all-time record.

Winter wheat was unchanged at 1,170,788,000 bushels.

Washington's spring wheat yield was placed at 3,900,000 bushels with an average of 25 bushels an acre. Oregon's was listed at 2,700,000 bushels with a 27-bushel-an-acre average.

Other indicated yields of important crops in the two states included:

Barley — Washington, 21,733,000 bushels and 31 bushels an acre; Oregon, 19,976,000 bushels and 34.5.

Dry peas — Washington, 1,030,000 pounds and 1,300 per acre.

Sugar beets — Washington, 816,000 tons and 24 an acre; Oregon 475,000 tons and 25 an acre.

Apple (production only) — Washington, 31,800,000 bushels; Oregon 2,680,000.

Peaches (production only) — Washington, 2,200,000 bushels.

Pears (production only) — Washington, 4,900,000 bushels; Oregon 5,600,000.

Cranberries (production only) — Washington, 49,500 barrels; Oregon 34,000.

Potatoes (fall crop) — Washington, 4,180,000 hundredweight and 230 an acre; Oregon, 6,210,000 and 230.

Hops — Washington, 29,760,000 pounds and 1,550 an acre; Oregon, 3,750,000 and 1,150.

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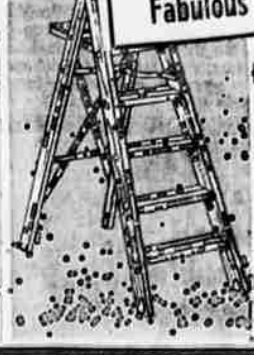
