Grocery Owner Tells Purchase

DUNSMUIR — Purchase of the

plat of land in north Dunsmuir, known as the Martinez property, was announced by Francis McEnerney.

Dunsmuir grocery store owner, McEnerney plans to remove the houses now on the site and subdivide into eight level lots for a home building project.

McEnerney in cooperation with Mike Fossa, contractor, now has a six unit house building program underway in the Kalela subdivision.

Three of the homes are completed and four are sold, McEnerney said today, and he hopes to start building on his new purchase late next summer. The four cottages and two houses on the Martinez property will be removed before new construction begins.

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Release Time Under Study

DUNSMUIR—Parents of elementary school students will be asked whether or not they approve of release time for religious education, Roger Ellis, superintendent, said recently.

Final action of the school board on this matter will depend upon the decision of the majority, according to Ellis.

The school board decided last month to forego granting time on Monday afternoons for children to be excused for religious instruction at churches of their parents' choice. State codes stipulate this time is made available at the option of the board.

Representatives from both Catholic and Protestant churches attended the board meeting Tuesday night to protest this decision. Noting that only about one fourth of the eligible students (fourth through eighth grades) availed themselves of religious study at this released time last year, the board decided to put the decision to the parents.

A committee of two board members, Ellis and a representative from each church will be asked to draft a ballot to submit to the parents. Ellis said the sole motivation of the board was to get maximum educational use of the school day by the majority of students.
